

Remarks on board the ship *Washington*

Friday the 29th Lat 15° 11' Long 91° W.
The first part of these 24 hours pleasant weather
the latter part gentle calm parted company with
the rest of the day and stood off.

Saturday the 30th off these 24 hours light
and pleasant heading off.

Sunday December the first off these 24 hours
pleasant weather and moderate breeze too.

Monday Dec the 2nd Lat 30° 1' Long 95° W.
The first part of these 24 hours light breeze and clear
the latter part full of rain and mizen top gillant sails
the weather came in raining.

Tuesday the 3rd
The first part of these 24 hours raining and calm
the 2nd part much the same we shifted the boats
and secured the fore and main top gillant sails
the latter part pleasant got the fore top gillant sail
steering off.

Wednesday the 4th Lat 20° 8'
The first part of these 24 hours open the breeze and
pleasant weather.

Thursday the 5th Lat 10° 4'
All these 24 hours moderate breeze and raining.

Friday the 6th All these 24 hours fresh breeze
and pleasant took in the top gillant sails tack
ship and stood to the eastward.

Saturday the 7th
All these 24 hours fresh breeze and clear weather
all hands employed in mending rope and repairing the rigging.

Sunday the 8th Lat 13° 30' W. The first part of these
24 hours gentle breeze and some rain some top
gillant sails steering off close to the wind.

Monday the 9th Lat 10° 43' W.
All these 24 hours moderate breeze and pleasant weather
took in the top gillant sails and hauled up the main sail.

Tuesday the 10th Lat 30° 33' S Long 110° 25' W.
The first part of these 24 hours fresh breeze and clear
in the first watch came away the gillant sails
hauled up the spanker the latter part more moderate
breeze.

Wednesday the 11th All these 24 hours fresh
breeze and clear weather the latter part the gill
sails and sent the gill sails ship for repairments.

Thursday the 12th All these 24 hours
moderate breeze and pleasant weather tack
ship and stood to the southward bent for top mast stay sail.

Friday the 13th Lat 40° 22' S Long 100° 53' W.
The first part of these 24 hours moderate breeze and
pleasant the latter part at anchor and got
to work by the waist boat on harbor boats.

Saturday the 14th
The first part of these 24 hours moderate breeze and
pleasant the boats still off after whale.

Sunday the 15th The first part of these 24 hours
all hands employed in cutting in the latter part commenced
hoisting.

Monday the 16th All hands employed in hoisting
raised a whale to board down the boats with
and secured pleasant weather and fresh breeze.

Tuesday the 17th The first part of these 24 hours
fresh breeze and pleasant in the latter part
the latter part the hands on deck employed in various
jobs the coopers at work on the orb saw a ship to seaward.

Wednesday the 18th The first part of these 24 hours
fresh breeze and pleasant made preparations for stowing
down the latter part commenced stowing.

Thursday the 19th
The first part of these 24 hours we finished the latter part
we brook for weather coopers the great reef for one
mizen top sails saw a fine sail storming wave.

Friday the 20th All these 24 hours fresh breeze
and pleasant weather fired a new pair of 32 lb. gunshots
passed a number of flocks of birds.

Saturday the 21st Lat 40° 37' S The first part
of these 24 hours fresh breeze and clear weather
the latter part hauled up the top sails.

Sunday the 22nd Lat 50° 34' S The first part of these
24 hours fresh gales and squalls kept a good fore
and the latter part fresh gales left hands at work on
top sails tack ship and stood to the southward.

Monday the 23rd Lat 60° 6' S All these 24 hours
fresh breeze and pleasant broke put for fresh water
in the spanker to make some alterations in it.
