

Remarks on board ship Washington Oct 2nd

Tuesday the 24th all these 24 hours fresh breezes heading S by E lat 8° 30'

Wednesday the 25th the first part of these 24 hours fresh breezes and pleasant all hands employed in the ships duty lat 9° 30' S long 100° 33' W

Thursday the 26th all these 24 hours fresh breezes backing ship and stood off E by S lat 11° 30' S

Friday the 27th all these 24 hours moderate breezes and cloudy lat 10° 18' S

Saturday the 28th all these 24 hours slight breezes with squalls and made no progress and fitted runner to the fore top sail. ~~Lat 10° 18' S~~

Sunday the 29th all these 24 hours gentle gales and pleasant weather all hands employed in making rope heading N by E lat 8° 30' S

Monday the 30th all these 24 hours moderate breezes and cloudy with squalls to be feared for the boats for them but got none came on board and heaving up the boats and continued the chase with the ship lat 6° 30' S

Tuesday the 31st the first part pleasant weather still in chase with the whale the 2nd part raised them off the barbed tow towards away but the whale perceiving the boats prevented us getting on

Wednesday January the first 1834

the first part of these 24 hours light breezes and cloudy the 2nd part packet ship the East foot packet again and stood off E by S lat 5° 45' S

Thursday Jan the 2nd all these 24 hours fresh breezes and cloudy weather for the 3rd and spanker went 6° S long 93° W

Friday the 3rd all these 24 hours fresh breezes and squally weather saw a fine black heading S by E

Saturday the 4th the first part fresh breezes the latter part match the same set main top galeent sail packet ship to the northward

January the 5th 1834

Sunday the 5th lat 4° 45' S long 94° W the first part fresh breezes and pleasant the latter part match the same

Monday the 6th the first part moderate breezes and pleasant weather the latter part set the top galeent sail heading S by E lat 4° 20' S

Tuesday the 7th the first part of these 24 hours moderate breezes and cloudy the latter part fresh gales for the top galeent sail heading S by E

Wednesday the 8th all these 24 hours fresh breezes and pleasant weather lat 4° 30' S

Thursday the 9th the first part moderate breezes the latter part match the same spoke ship George of New Bedford

Friday the 10th all these 24 hours fresh breezes and cloudy weather single reefed fore and main top sails

Saturday the 11th all these 24 hours fresh gales took out four fresh water and used lat 6° 15' S

Sunday the 12th lat 4° 45' S long 81° 30' W all these 24 hours fresh breezes and cloudy weather

Monday the 13th lat 4° 45' S long 81° 30' W all these 24 hours moderate breezes and pleasant packet ship to the southward standing in shore

Tuesday the 14th lat 5° S long 81° 30' W these 24 hours fresh gales and cloudy for the main top galeent sail and set up main fore and stay heading to the southward

Wednesday the 15th lat 5° S long 81° 30' W all these 24 hours fresh breezes and cloudy weather packet ship to the eastward sent a main top galeent sail

Thursday the 16th lat 6° S long 81° 30' W all these 24 hours fresh gales saw a number of black fish set the top galeent sail heading S by E

Friday the 17th all these 24 hours fresh gales single reefed fore and main top sails packet ship to the southward

Saturday the 18th the first part the Taylor boat got a 16 barrel whale the latter part lat 6° 15' S
