Wednesday march the 11th lat 21° 4' N long 90° 45' E the first part moderate breeze and pleasant the day we were out of sight the land the 2 captains still on shore

Thursday the 12th lat 21° 4' N long 90° 45' E the first part moderate breeze and pleasant the day we were out of sight the land the 2 captains still on shore

Friday the 13th the first part moderate gales and stormy at 2 o'clock discourse Charles island and sailing E. S. E. by having some wind and current presented getting up the water part about a new main sail flying full and fore top, gale, sail the

Saturday the 14th the first part light air and pleasant no land in sight after 10 pm running to the anchorage and the mate went on shore the water part calm and warm and the ship rose of new day 100 to 100 barbs

Sunday the 15th the first part pleasant weather and calm spoke the ship, language of sailing 2 pleasant 600 to 100 barbs lat 16° 8' long 90° 33' W

Monday the 16th the first part calm and pleasant this day we got 1 within 2 leagues of the land and the captain came off with the captain of the omegar after a weeks absence the water part pleasant and calm our course for further distance was 18 to 18

Tuesday the 17th the first part light air and pleasant on shore under full sail in 10 fathoms of water the water part the our mate and the mate of the omegar went ashore on the land island and loaded 2 boats with turpin

Wednesday the 18th the first part these 24 hours pleasant the 2 captains landed with 6 boats and loaded them all from turpin very large some 300 lbs each

Thursday the 19th the first part pleasant weather and calm all hands ashore turpin

Friday the 20th pleasant weather all hands employed in getting turpin the water part much the same

Saturday the 21st the first part both ships crews getting turpin the water part the same 3 of the omegar crew run away with cooking, tools and other necessary things

Sunday the 22nd the 24 hours pleasant weather all hands employed on shore
