

Remarks written on board ship, day being, &c.

Friday the 2nd the first part pleasant and light breeze saw a ship to leeward chasing whale the latter part we raised a large whale chased him into the sea some men shot at him

Saturday the 3rd the breeze from N to S light winds and pleasant weather through the last 24 hours

Sunday the 4th all these 24 hours light winds and pleasant weather saw a small sperm whale

Monday the 5th lat 50° 50' N long 87° 5' W saw whales and chased them got none light winds and pleasant through the last 24 hours

Tuesday the 6th all these 24 hours fresh breeze spoke ship the richard mistook the capt went on board

Wednesday the 7th the first part fresh gales and rain, fairs with top gullent sails the latter part fresh gales and cloudy gales with the whole ship the day

Thursday the 8th all these 24 hours fresh gales and cloudy weather for all hands employed making small rope for ratting

Friday the 9th came from N to S lat 50° 30' N saw several ships but spoke none fresh breeze and heavy squalls from the SE

Saturday the 10th all these 24 hours fresh gales and squalls at times in place in various parts got out fresh water &c

Sunday the 11th fresh gales and pleasant weather the sea rough

Monday the 12th all these 24 hours fresh gales and cloudy squalls and gales with the ritching mistle and some saw more ships to windward

Tuesday the 13th lat 51° 30' N long 111° 15' W all these 24 hours fresh breeze and pleasant weather

Wednesday the 14th all these 24 hours moderate breeze and whales and chased them but got none saw the richard mistook got a whale

Thursday the 15th lat 51° 5' N long 115° 15' W all these 24 hours light winds and pleasant saw more whales going the wind was got none

Friday the 16th lat 51° 30' N long 118° 15' W the first part of these 24 hours saw up to 4000 of the seals and struck a large whale the 2 latter parts had very little damage done

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Saturday the 17th the first part of these 24 hours 2 whale boats and 2 men going out the 2nd part 2 whale boats in place in cutting the latter part of in whale boats in the evening and began hobbling

Sunday the 18th all these 24 hours moderate weather all hands employed as were mentioned

Monday the 19th the first part saw whale got none saw the ship ritching mistle and whale the latter part we chased whale by gales and

Tuesday the 20th the first part of these 24 hours pleasant weather finished speaking a whale and washed off the deck the latter part got out fresh water and got the water keels a soft for shaving down

Wednesday the 21st all these 24 hours all hands busy speaking down the first part of these 24 hours fresh gales and squalls the latter part mistle the same all hands employed in various parts in the ships duty

Thursday the 22nd the first part of these 24 hours fresh gales and squalls the latter part mistle the same all hands employed in various parts in the ships duty

Friday the 23rd lat 51° 30' N long 118° 15' W all these 24 hours fresh gales heavy squalls top gullent sails, coral from 8 to 10 to 12 through these last 24 hours

Saturday the 24th all these 24 hours pleasant weather without a main sail and but another

Sunday the 25th lat 51° 30' N long 121° 15' W all these 24 hours light winds and pleasant weather these 24 hours pleasant weather we found our fresh water casks mitch and starting it in to other casks

Monday the 26th the first part of these 24 hours pleasant weather we found our fresh water casks mitch and starting it in to other casks

Tuesday the 27th lat 51° 15' N long 124° 15' W all these 24 hours light breeze and pleasant all hands in flour as yesterday

Wednesday the 28th all these 24 hours moderate breeze and saw a few birds and charge sculls of another small fish

Thursday the 29th all these 24 hours pleasant weather spoke and chased the richard mistle the latter part had a boat stove by whale the crew had a narrow escape
