 fresh breeze and squally weather. Spoke the
 maine top galeant sailed with ship to the southward
 Sailed the 21st lat 30° S
 All these 24 hours fresh breeze and pleasant
 weather Sunday June the first 1834
 All these 24 hours fresh breeze and squally
 spoke barque coral & mouthed 300 lbs
 Monday the 2nd lat 7° 40' S long 100° 5' W
 All these 24 hours moderate breeze and
 squally, started ship to the southward
 Tuesday the 3rd lat 7° 0' S at 7 am squally weather
 came down the boats and got 2 by the starboard
 and waist boats the water part got 1 one cut in
 Wednesday the 4th the first part of these
 24 hours with hands in place putting fire and
 loading the water part much the same
 Thursday the 5th all these 24 hours light breeze and
 pleasant weather at hand in place in morning
 spoke ship servant of Plymouth South
 Friday the 6th all these 24 hours pleasant
 weather finished loading at 3 pm the galeant
 servant to depart with ship to the southward
 Saturday the 7th the first part began
 to draw down the water part much the same
 Sunday the 8th all these 24 hours fresh breeze
 and cloudy weather started ship to the southward
 Monday the 9th the first part commenced stowing
 down the water part finished
 Tuesday the 10th all these 24 hours
 fresh breeze and squally weather
 Wednesday the 11th lat 5° 30' S got 2. whale
 by the starboard and harbor boats
 From the 12th to Tuesday the 17th all hands
 imployed in packing, loading and stowing down

in 1834
 Thursday the 29th fresh breeze lat 30° S
 and pleasant this day we parted company
 with the maine and spoke our course to the
 southward with a fresh breeze and fair
 Friday the 28th fresh breeze lat 30° S
 changed the top galeant sails, hauled up the main
 sail and bore the wack for the night
 Saturday the 29th lat 1° steering N by E
 the wind a strong fresh breeze and squally
 Sunday the 30th lat 2° 30' S course to the fresh
 breeze and squally weather through these last 24 hours
 Monday June the 31st lat 3° 45' steering to the
 southward
 Tuesday the 1st July the first part covered hands
 and parcels in cargo houses and cleared weather
 Wednesday the 2nd all these 24 hours fresh breeze
 and pleasant weather finished making and mending tops
 galeant sails 10 course water 8 by 11
 Thursday the 3rd lat 4° 30' S course to the
 fresh breeze and squally these 24 hours
 Friday the 4th lat 6° 0' S course to the single
 reefed the top galeant sails and flying jib
 Saturday the 5th lat 6° 15' long 101° 15' W
 course east lat the top galeant sails and flying jib
 light winds and pleasant these last 24 hours
 Sunday the 6th lat 6° 30' S all these 24 hours
 calm and pleasant course S by E
 Monday the 7th all these 24 hours fresh breeze and
 sailing steering to the eastward nine 11
 Tuesday the 8th lat 7° 15' long 97° 15' W
 all these 24 hours fresh breeze and cloudy weather
 hauled the top galeant sails and flying jib down
 reefed the top sails 8 by 11
 Wednesday the 9th all these 24 hours more calm
 and pleasant steering to the eastward
 and flying jib
