& Latter part Thick Breezes they
saw the Land Bearing W.N.W. Dist
50 miles Land Bearing
Lat 23 38 Long 36:55

29th Four part Light Breezes and pleasant
Middle & Latter part the same
Lat 23 93

30th Four part Light Breezes and pleasant
and Middle & Latter part the same
Lat 23 27 Long 39:14

April first Five pleasant weather from
the S.E. head East

April 2nd Strong Breezes and pleasant Middle
& Latter part Strong gale from
S.E.
Lat 23 21 Long 41:02

35th Channel and a rugged place it is & Downy with
April Strong gale and cloudy all the 24 hours
3rd from the S.E. head to the East
they end Lat 23 27 Long 41 55
4th All the 24 hours Strong Breezes and
pleasant head to the Eastward at
10 PM saw the Land of Madagascar
Bearing from N.E. to S.E.

5th Four part Light (Wind) and pleasant
Middle part the same at 2 AM came
anchor at St Augustines Bay in
12 fathoms muddy Bottom 1 Horn Bird
lying their French Bird to the Isle of
France this is the hardest place I ever saw
the Deck is full of Natives all the time
Men Women and children at work they
all took their leave much to my
satisfaction they end this Day
