Tues 4th Employed at Ship Duty
1 watch on shore

6) John Winslow Dec 28th 1852
Wed 5th 1 watch on duty the other on duty

Thurs 6th 1 watch on shore the other on duty
If all hands on duty got all ready
to go to sea and had a
very heavy tempest all the first
part of the night

This makes 2 times I have been to
Madagascar and I hope I shall
never go there again if you think
it is the worse place a man can
get the small pox is raging here
and the natives and
a miserable other the whole
and you cannot get any thing
to carry to sea but wood and
Water & gun powder
