

Thursday 6<sup>th</sup>  
Bound to The Sandwich Islands

First part of this 24 hours  
a strong breeze from S.W. got up a jiggermast  
and set maintopgallantail heading E by N at  
at 6 P.M. set half watches. Middle the same  
at 6 A.M. called all hands. Latter part a fresh  
gale from the W. and frequent squalls of rain.  
All hands employed in rigging a bowsprit.

Friday 7<sup>th</sup>

First part of this 24 hours  
a heavy gale from the W. and heavy squalls  
got out the bowsprit course E by N at 6 P.M.  
set half. Middle a strong breeze from S.W.  
and fine weather. Latter part the breeze increased  
and a bad sea ran. All hands at work fitting  
and rigging the mainmast for a foretopmast &c  
making a fore yard.

Saturday 8<sup>th</sup>

First part of this 24 hours  
a fresh gale from S.W. squalls E by N a very  
bad sea on and shipping so much water that  
we had to quit work at 2 P.M. set the main  
topgallantail on the stump of the mainmast  
Middle part the same with rain.

Latter part a moderate breeze and fine weather  
set up a foretopmast.

Sunday 9<sup>th</sup>

First part of this 24 hours a moderate breeze from  
S.W. and fine weather. All hands employed in fitting  
rigging making a fore yard and bending a gill.  
Middle part fine weather. Latter part the same  
All hands employed in sending up a foremast and  
foretopmast and bending a foretopmast.

Sunday 10<sup>th</sup>

First part of this 24 hours  
a moderate breeze from the S.W. and fine weather  
steering E by N. All hands at work in fitting rigging  
and breaking out for sails and water at 6 P.M. set  
the watch. Middle part the same. Latter part  
foggy. All hands employed in fitting the mainmast  
and rigging.

Tuesday 11<sup>th</sup>

First part of this 24 hours  
a moderate breeze from the W. and thick fog. All  
hands employed in fitting mainmast and rigging  
steering E by N. At 6 P.M. set half watches.

Middle part the same the wind from S.W. & E  
Latter part the wind S.W. and rain got up  
the mainmast.

Wednesday 12<sup>th</sup>

First part of this 24  
hours a strong breeze from the W. and fine  
weather and heavy squalls. All hands employed in  
fitting rigging and bent a main staysail.  
Middle part squalls. Latter part a strong  
breeze and fine weather. All hands employed in  
fitting rigging and a foretopmast yard.

Lat 39.52 N Long 173.33 W

Thursday 13<sup>th</sup>

This 24 hours a moderate breeze  
from the W. and fine weather steering E by N  
bent a foresail. Middle part a light breeze and  
baffling. Latter part a light breeze from the  
S.W. and overcast. All hands employed in fitting  
rigging and foretopmast.
