

Ship Benjamin Tucker in Port of
Tuesday Dec the 30th

Just part of the 24 hours
Weather tolerable fine commenced to unrig
Ship uncut all the Sails sent in fore
Broom and down fore top Sail Yard Middle
part rainy latter part quiet fine sent down all
the yards and main top Mast and unshipped
the stump of the bowsprit and sent it ashore
Wednesday the 31st

Just part weather fine
Sent all our spare spars ashore and a lot
of empty Casks received a try post from Bark
Eugene of Stonington Caulkers employed
Caulking ships & Middle part rainy
At 6 A.M. got Shears up and took out our
jury Main Mast and the stump of the old
Mast and sent them ashore felled the
Shears off to take out the Miz Mast
sent the rigging down and broke out
round the Mast and got all ready to
hoist it out Port of Honolulu

Thursday the 1st of January 1857

Weather rather rainy
at 1 P.M. felled the Shears off
to take out the Miz Mast broke
out round the Mast and got all ready
to hoist it out at 8 A.M. hoisted the Mast
out and sent it ashore crew employed
Scaffolding Ships & various other jobs

Friday the 2nd

Weather still rainy but light
crew employed Scaffolding Ships and
other jobs Latter part got the Miz Mast
off from the shore and put it in and stepped
Caulkers employed Caulking upper works
Port of Honolulu

Honolulu Capt. A.D. Barker Dec/56
Saturday the 3rd of Jan 1857

Just part of the
24 hours got off the Main Mast from the shore
felled the Shears from the Miz Mast and took
in the main and stepped it Caulkers and
Carpenters to work on ships part of the
crew employed Scaffolding Ships

Port of Honolulu

Sunday the 4th

Just part weather fine
crew employed Scaffolding Ships & sent
down our jury fore top Mast and got off
a lot of new rigging from the shore
at 4 P.M. sent down the jury fore mast
latter part the crew ashore on liberty

Monday the 5th

Weather fine got out the stump
of the fore Mast and sent it ashore five men
from the shore employed fitting the main
rigging crew employed at various jobs
Caulkers employed Caulking Ships Carpenters to
work all Port of Honolulu

Tuesday the 6th

Weather fine and pleasant
got the fore mast off from the shore
and got it in riggers employed fitting
rigging and crew employed at various
jobs Caulkers still to work and Carpenters
Wednesday the 7th

Discharged from Ship Ben Tucker
January 12th 1857 by Master Condens
