June 20th Fine clear weather and moderate calm. Put some mail on board of homeward bound schooner (3). Lighted a fruit steamer bound North.
Lat 36-40 Long 73-04

June 21st Raised whales in the morning. Lowered and got a small bull. Got along with at noon and commenced to cut in. Calm and light swell. commenced to boil at 9 AM.
Lat 36-25 Long 73-04

June 22nd Strong S.W. wind and heavy sea. Boiling. Spoke the Pearl Net in at Lumberton.
Lat 36-30 Long 72-50. Through boiling at 9.

June 23rd Weather moderated. Stowing down at Lumberton the Pearl Net. Lighted steamer.
Lat 36-30 Long 73-09

June 24th Fine weather. Pearl Net in sight. Finished stowing down air.
Lat 37-00 Long 73-00

June 25th Very light breeze and smooth sea. Lighted several boats.
Lat 36-25 Long 73-43

June 26th Moderate breeze. Raised whales at sunrise. Lowered down the boat in the morning and again after dinner. But did not strike any until sunset. Started to sink (boat).
Lat 35-48 Long 74-09

June 27th Very fine weather. Raised whales in the morning. Began to cut in at 4 A.M. Lowered down after supper and stuck one. Got along with at sunrise.

June 28th Clear sky and calm. Boiling. Raised whales close aboard at noon. Lowered and got two small cows. and cut them in by 8 AM.
Lat 36-00 Long 73-29

June 29th Fine weather. Boiling.
Lat 36-00 Long 73-36

June 30th Fine weather. Boiling at noon and began to clear up. Fine weather.
Lat 36-00 Long 74-05. Caught porpoise.

July 1st Continued fine weather. Raised school of porpoises. Clearing up seas.
Lat 36-00 Long 73-55

July 2nd Light breeze and clear sky. Schools of porpoises. Lighted lower sail.
Lat 36-15 Long 74-14. Porpoises.

July 3rd Fine weather and light swell. caught a porpoise. Raised schools of porpoises.
Lat 36-00 Long 74-10

July 4th Fresh East wind and clear sky. Moderate sea. Raised schools of porpoises and porpoises.
Lat 36-30 Long 73-15

July 5th Fresh S.W. breeze and heavy swell. Passed U.S. Transport, "McPherson" in tow going Northward. Sent down the jiff-boat, repaired and reboiled. Smoky horizon.
Lat 37-30 Long 73-54

July 6th Wind S.W. and heavy swell. Put bent the jib and bent one in good order. Weather smoky and cloudy. Three cuts.
Lat 37-00 Long 73-37

July 7th Heavy swell and squalls through the night. Glorified by better weather after sunrise. Lighted on frontier and a sail. S.W. wind and indistinct horizon.
Lat 36-40 Long 73-33

July 8th Smooth sea and very light breeze. Sent some letters by Mr. Jamaica of Bergen, bound to New York. Spoke Mr. "Wicks" at sunset.
Lat 36-40 Long 73-24

July 9th Calm and rain, very heavy through the night. Part of the time, light N.E. breeze.
Lat 36-40 Long 73-24. D.R.

July 10th Rain. Wind increased to gale during the morning watch. Put bent the jib in forenoon. Reboot the jacks at 9 A.M. Light
