

Aug 13th S.W. squalls through the night and first part of the day. Put some letters on board of Danish str. "Lok" Cabin in the P.M. Finbacks.
Lat 37 Long 73 - 00

Aug 14th Rain squalls through the night and heavy rain until 3 P.M. when the sun came out a little. Saw a school of grampus. Lighted two seals
Lat. D.R. Long. 73 - 00

Aug 15th Moderate sea and brisk S.W. wind. Clear weather. Lighted some seals and three steamers.
Lat. 37 - 30 Long. 72 - 07

Aug 16th Light S.W. breeze and choppy sea. during the A.M. Heavy squall in the afternoon followed by a calm with very smooth sea. Sky smoky.
Lat. 37 - 05 Long. 71 - 30

Aug 17th Moderate S.W. wind and smooth sea. Clear sky, but rather smoky horizon. Large school of porpoise, and caught one. Lighted two steamers going Eastward. Rave off a new main boom topping lift.
Lat. 37 - 30 Long. 71 - 30

Aug 18th Heavy sea and strong S.W. wind through the night and fore noon. Sky cloudy. Moderated some in the afternoon but the sea is still rough
Lat. 37 - 05 Long. 72 - 27

Aug 19th Rough sea and fresh S.W. wind. Sky cloudy. Lighted a three masted schooner in the morning.
Lat. 37 - 40 Long. 72 - 30

Aug 20th Light S.W. breeze and smooth sea, with cloudy sky. Lighted a seal and a steamer.
Lat 37 - 10 Long. 71 - 20

Aug 21st Calm and very little swell. Raised some spouts and lowered. Lat made

them out to be killers. Very hot day.
Lighted a steamer.
Lat. 37 - 06 Long. 71 - 30

Aug 22nd Light N.E. wind and smooth sea. In the fore noon, spoke the Ste Admiral Farragut of Perth Amboy and got some papers. At noon raised some whales but did not get any.
Lat 37 - 15 Long 70 - 30

Aug 23rd Raised whales at day break. Lowered at 11 A.M. but could not get anything. Heavy squall at 8 o'clock, after that moderate S.W. wind with smooth sea.
Lat 37 - 45 Long. 69 - 06

Aug 24th Light southerly breeze and calm sea in the A.M. freshening up with rough sea and squally toward evening. Picked up a hard pine stick.
Lat 38 - 27 Long. 69 - 25

Aug 25th Fresh S.W. breeze through the night and squalls. At 1 P.M. sent an anchor and breasted N.W. Wind moderated and weather became misty in the fore noon. At 3 P.M. wind veered to the N.E. and died out calm. At 4 P.M. sailed and got 35 fathoms with soft mud. At noon Lat 40 - 34. Long 70 - 18

Aug 26th Calm, with light air and a white sand. Sailed at 6 am. and got 30 fathoms. Several seals seen. At 3 P.M. made out Gay Head and Norman's Land. Saw school of finners.
