

Journal of a Whaling voyage on board the Schooner
 Mrs. H. Rogers, in the North Atlantic Ocean, 1902.
 John A. Dunham, Master.

Saturday
 Feb. 23, 1902

At 9 a.m. got underway from the City wharf
 New Bedford, with a light breeze from the North-East
 at 10.40 passed Clarke's Point and at 1.15 passed Gay
 Head, about the chains and stowed them away. At 5 p.m.
 set the watches. Course South. So ends this day's work.

May. 23, 1902.

This day begins with a very light breeze
 from North-East. At 5 p.m. wind hauled to the S.W.
 changed course to S. by E. Saw one fire master's head this day.

Lat. 40-31 Long.

" 24,

This day comes in with a fresh breeze from the
 N. N. E. Course South at 7 p.m. took in staysail and
 topsail. So ends this day.

Lat. 35-58 Long. 69-00

" 25

This day comes in with a fresh breeze from
 the North. Steering S. E. by S. under three jibs, fore-
 sail and topsail in the Gulf Stream riding all day.
 Lat. 36-28 Long. 00-00 So ends this day.

" 26

This day comes in with a fresh breeze from the
 North. At 5 p.m. put up reef in the fore-sail and took
 in the jib. Course S. E. by E. So ends this day.

Lat. Long.

" 27

This day comes in with a fresh breeze from the
 North at 9 a.m. hauled down the topsail and
 run S. E. by E. under two reefed fore-sail and fore-
 staysail. Later part the same. So ends this day.

Lat. Long.

" 28

This day comes in with a fresh breeze from the
 North at 5 a.m. took the fore-sail, set one and main
 topsails and changed course to S. by E. at 8 a.m. set the
 mainmast and reefed and at 11.30 set the whole main
 sail and topsail and staysail without the fore-
 sail to repair and at 6 p.m. put the fore-sail and
 set it changed course to S. E. Light breeze and all sail
 out. So ends this day. Lat. 36-33 Long. 62-20

" 29

This day comes in with a light breeze
 from E. S. E. Vessel steering South with all sail out
 Later part the same. So ends this day.

Lat. 27-49 Long. 61-44

" 30

This day comes in with a fine breeze from
 S. S. E. Course South with all sail out
 at 4 p.m. changed course to S. by E. Later part
 the same. So ends this day.

Lat. 25-30 Long. 61-20
