

Monday, Nov. 31st Journal Continued

This day comes in with a fresh breeze from the C. S. E. Course South all day. Latter part the same. So ends this day. Lat. Long.

April 1st. This day comes in with a fresh breeze from E. S. E. at 8 a.m. put two reefs in the mainsail and set the fly jib and at 11.30 set the mainsail and at 8 p.m. put a single reef in squally and rainy. Course South. So ends this day. Lat. Long.

2nd. This day comes in with a fresh breeze from C. S. E. at 11.30 a.m. took the reef out of the mainsail and set the topsail and at 1 p.m. took in topsail and put a reef in the mainsail. Steering S. S. E. So ends this day. Lat 19.01 Long. 61.20

3rd. This day comes in with a fresh breeze from E. S. E. at 8 a.m. took the reef out of the mainsail and set the topsail Course South. So ends this day. Lat. Long.

4th. This day comes in with a light breeze from E. S. E. with a smooth sea Steering S. S. E. At 6 p.m. made deviate ahead. Took up the chains and bent them round hauled man to the N. E. with a fine breeze. So ends this day. Lat. Long.

5th. This day comes in with a light breeze from the Eastward at 8 a.m. Captain went on shore at Grand Bourg and at 9 a.m. came to anchor at Louis, Marie Galante. At 6 p.m. got underway for Dominica breeze very light. So ends this day.

6th. This day comes in fine came to anchor very early at Prince Rupert's our employed in various jobs also trading, at 6 p.m. got underway for St. Vincent with it calm. Ship three men. So ends this day.

Sunday 6th. This day comes in with it calm at 6 a.m. sighted the Bark Greyhound, of New Bedford, Capt. Edwards from Barbados. At 10 a.m. ~~at 10 a.m. a sunstroke~~ a sunstroke and calf whale going quick so gave chase up. Went along side of the ship. Romanus of New York and sent letters. At 3 p.m. breeze up ~~at 3 p.m. breeze up~~ squared away for St. Vincent. So ends this day.

7th. This day comes in with the fresh trade winds at morning in breast Martinique, at noon bent St. Lucia and at night in breast of St. Vincent. Put a single reef in the mainsail and took in fly jib So ends this day.

Tue. Apr. 8 Journal Continued

This day comes in with light rain also light breeze at 6.30 came to anchor in Kingstown Harbor St. Vincent. The crew employed in various jobs around deck, at 6 p.m. one half the crew went on shore. So ends this day. Lat. 9.

9. This day comes in with fine weather, all hands employed in various jobs about deck, at 6 p.m. men went on shore again. So ends this day.

10. This day comes in with fine weather at 9 a.m. shipped five men from here also took the men we got in Dominica on shore to be sighted at 11 a.m. got underway for Blauquilla, at 6 p.m. off St. Vincent. So ends this day.

11. This day comes in with a fine breeze from the Eastward vessel steering S. S. E. at 6 p.m. sighted land and at 7 p.m. shortened sail and hove to head to the north. So ends this day. Lat. 12.12 Long. 63.45

12. This day comes with fine weather at daybreak made sail and steered S. W. at 1 p.m. sighted Blauquilla and at 5 p.m. came to anchor. So ends this day.

13. This day comes in with fine weather at daylight got underway and went out on a cruise but saw nothing at 9 a.m. it breezed up fresh so came back to anchor and went on shore and got three pigs at 12 o'clock vessel broke against it hove up the anchor and made sail, left off for Bain d'Azur Latter part moderate. So ends this day.

14. This day comes in with a fresh breeze from the Eastward, at noon sighted the Roques and at 5.31 p.m. hauled up for San Domingo Latter part the same. So ends this day.

15. This day comes in with a fresh breeze from the Eastward Steering N. W. for San Domingo Latter part the same So ends this day.

16. This day comes in with a fine breeze, Steering N. W. for San Domingo. Saw Blackbird Latter part the same So ends this day.

17. This day comes in with fine weather at 5 a.m. sighted Alta Jela and at 9 a.m. came to anchor between False Cape and Cape Royal. Sent down the main topmast also oars and brush trees to be fixed So ends this day.
