Thursday Feb. 19th
At 2 p.m. left the City wharf, wind S. W.
and at 2.30 came to anchor off Clark's Point
with a very fresh breeze and foggy at 7 p.m. set
anchor watch weather the same So ends this day.

Fri. Mar. 20th
This day comes in with a fresh breeze from
the S. W. and thick fog lying at anchor off
Clark's Point. Latter part the same So ends this day.
Lat. 32.1

Sat. 3.21
This day comes in with a light breeze from the
S. W. and raining. Lying at anchor off Clark's Point.
Latter part fresh breeze and raining. So ends this day.
Sun. 3.22

This day comes in with a light breeze from
the N. E. and raining. At anchor off Clark's Point.
Latter part the same So ends this day.
Mon. 3.23

This day comes in with a fresh breeze from
the W. B. and raining. Lying at anchor off Clark's
Point. Middle part of the day moderate. Latter
part a fresh breeze from the Southward and rain.
Tues. 24.

This day comes in with a light breeze from
the S. W. and foggy. At anchor off Clark's Point.
Latter part calm and thick fog.
Wed 25.

This day comes in with a fresh breeze from the
Westward. At 11 a.m. got underway from off Clark's Point
and at 2 p.m. passed Gay Head. At 4 p.m. took
in the main-sail and set the top-sail. At 5 p.m.
lost sight of land. So ends this day. Course South
Thurs. 26.

This day comes in with a fresh breeze
from the W. W. At 11 a.m. set the main-sail
and top-sail and at 1 p.m. set the stay-sail.
Latter part more moderate. Saw 1 Ste. and 1 Brig.
Course South. Lat. 38.27 Long. 70.15 So ends this day.
Fri. 27.

This day begins with a light breeze from the
Westward. Steering S. by E. with all sail. Out-
due three masts in sight. Bowed to the Southward.
Latter part moderate. Lat 36.25 Long 69.24 So ends this day.
