Comes in with good weather and a fresh breeze from the S.W. made sail and stood to the Southward. At 2 p.m. raised whales in the stream could not get to them, hauled to the Westward and took in sail at sunset.

Fri. 3rd Lat. 36-35 Long.
Comes in moderate make sail and worked to the Eastward. At noon came in foggy and at 4 p.m. sighted the Chase and at 5 p.m. went on board of her. Took in sail and layed to the Westward. Lat 36-24 Long. 74-01

Lat. 4th Comes in moderate at day-light whales around the vessel. Comes in company with the Chase. Chase's boat struck, took the whale along-side of her and cut him in raised more whales. Could the Chase get one, she got 2 and the mate got store and lost one. Whale came alongside and made fast for night heading to the Westward. Capt. of the Chase came along-side and took one whale to cut and boil.

Sat. 5th Comes in with it moderate from S.W. At 4 a.m. hooked on to the whale to cut and at 7 a.m. raised a lone whale covered one boat and gave chase raised more whales covered another boat. Whales going quick gave up the chase. Went along-side of S.S. Julia of Wilmington, Del. and got some Gas oil. At 5 p.m. raised a school of whales covered and the Chase got one and we got one and we got one. Came alongside and made fast for the night. Fresh breeze and rough. Lat. 37-15 Long. 73-09

Wed. 8 Comes in moderate in company with the A. Chase. At 5 p.m. sent the boat on board of her and got 7 bbls of oil.

Comes in with a light breeze from S.W. and rising. A Chase in sight. Latter part the same.

Fri. 10 Comes in with a fresh breeze from the S.E. and rough in company with the A Chase. Lat. 36-17 Long. 74-32

Sat. 11th Comes in with a heavy breeze from the S.E. and very rough. At noon spoke the S.S. San Marcos of N.Y. bound North vessel under no reef fore-sail, top-sail and fore-staysail.
Lat. 36-05 Long. 75-05

Sun. 12 Comes in with a heavy breeze from the S.E. and rough. Saw the S.S. Katahdin of Boston vessel under short sail. At 5 p.m. parted the fore stay. Latter part the same.
Lat. 35-58

Mon. 13 Comes in with a heavy breeze from the S.E. and a heavy sea. Vessel under short sail. Saw one vessel. Latter part the same.
Lat. 35-50 Long. 74-48

Tues. 14 Comes in with a fresh breeze from the S.E. and rough. Vessel under one reef, four-sail, top-sail. A number of Steamers and vessels in sight. Had 38 fathoms of water.

Wed. 15 Comes in with a moderate breeze from the S.W. At 7 a.m. made sail and stood to the S.E. Sent letters by the Sch. Sarah Fells and spoke the S.S. Brookline. Latter part moderate.

Thurs. 16 Comes in with a light breeze from the S.W. made sail and stood to the S.E. At 2 p.m. raised one whale and at 6 p.m. gained the E. L. Swift. At sunset took in sail.

Fri. 17 Comes in with a fair breeze from the S.W. At 4 a.m. made sail and run to the S.E. 4 whales in sight. At 7 p.m. met alongside of a Steamer and sent letters.
Lat. 36-30 Long. 73-40

Sat. 18 Comes in fair breeze S.W. vessel under all sail. Caught one dolphin and one porpoise. Latter part the same.
Lat. 36-53 Long. 73-15

Sun. 19 Comes in with a light breeze from S.W. made sail and stood to the Southward. At noon spoke an English Steamer bound East. At 12-30 raised whale going to bow and gave chase in company with the Chase and Swift. Whales going quick gave up the chase. Latter part the same.
Lat. 37-04 Long. 73-00
