Mon. 25

Comes in moderate with rain squalls from the
S.W. At 6 a.m. Capt. of the Chase came on
board and got some papers. At 7 a.m. kept
off and went to the Eastward in company with the
Chase and Golden City At sunset hauled to

Tues. 26

Comes in with a fresh breeze from the S.W. with rain
veel running to the Eastward in company with
the Chase until sunset

Wed. 27

Whales

Comes in with a light breeze from the S.W.
At 5 a.m. saw the Chase with boats down
Lowers and took the boat up again on acct.
of squall and rain At 10 a.m. raised a
school of whales lowed but could not head them off
whales were going very quick to windward gave up
the chase and came aboard.

Thurs. 28

Home
bound

Comes in with a light breeze from the S.W.
with rain steering to the Eastward in company
with the Chase Crew employed in scraping and
doing various jobs about the ship. At 7 p.m.
kept off St. Homeward bound with all sail on.

Fri. 29

Comes in with a fresh breeze from the S.W.
also squalls and rain veel under 2 top-sails
and jibs until noon then set the main-sail
2 reefs At 3 p.m. all sail out steering St. St. W.
Saw 2 vessels came on soundings at 6 p.m.

Sat. 30

Comes in with a very light breeze from the
North At 5 a.m. made Black Island 3 points on
the weather bow. Crew all employed in various jobs
about the ship. At 4 p.m. bent the chains and at 4:30
breezed up from the S.W. light.

Sund. 31

July 1904

Comes in with a fresh breeze from the S.W.
At 4 a.m. was abreast of the Hens. and chickens L.S.
and at 7 a.m. came to anchor at Butler's flats
and at 2 p.m. was towed to the wharf.
It ends this voyage.
