Thurs. June 1 This day comes in with a fresh S. Easter
cloudy and rough vessel under short sail
At 4 p.m. spoke the S. S. Ely. bound S
Latter part the same. So ends this day
Lat 36-50 Long 74-09

Fri. 2 This day comes in with it moderate
from the S. E. Vessel under short sail
Four whales in sight. Latter part - calm
So ends this day. Lat. 36-40 Long. 74-08

Sat. 3 This day comes in with a fresh breeze
from the S. E. Vessel under Jibs, forenoon
and top sail. At 3 p.m. - fanned the
S. S. Swift - and at 5 p.m. saw E. B.
Conwell and Golden City with boats down
caught - sight of sports - one whales
going quick. Made sail - but did not
lower. Took in sail at sunset
So ends this day. Lat. 36-45 Long. 74-23

Sund. 4 This day comes in with a light breeze and
sun north from the S. E. At 4 a.m. made
sail and steered to the Eastward in company
with 3 whales. At 11.30 went on board of
the A. D. Nichols of N. Y. and sent letters bound
to Savannah etc. At 2 p.m. raised a
school of whales lowered and the Starboard
boat struck and lost him and then the
larboard - boat struck the same whale came
along side and cut him in. So ends this day.

Mon. 5 This day comes in with a deep breeze
from the S. E. and rough. Saw Golden City
cutting in S. B. Conwell and Swift in
sight. At 3 p.m. set - main sail and
at sunset took it in again. So ends
this day. Lat. 37-01 Long. 74.03

Tues. 6 This day comes with a fresh breeze
from the S. E. and rough.
Crew employed in working on oil
Latter part the same. So ends this day.
Lat. 37.01 Long. 74.04

Weds. 7 This day comes in with a fresh breeze
from the S. E. and rough.
Golden City in sight. Latter part the
same. So ends this day.
Lat 36-52 Long. 73-56

Thurs. 8 This day comes in with a fresh S. E.
and rough vessel under short sail. Three
whales in sight - also 2 fur ceases
Latter part the same. So ends this day.
Lat 36-44 Long. 74-15

Fri. 9 This day comes in with a fresh breeze from
the S. E. Vessel under top sail in company
with 4 whales. At 3 p.m. set the main
sail and at 4 p.m. saw the Golden City
with her boats down made all sail and
left her off for her. Raised the whale and
lowered and struck one and came along
side and made fast for the night S. E.
Swift got one. So ends this day.
Lat 36-36 Long 74-10

Sat. 10 This day comes in with a fine light
breeze from the S. E. At daylight hooked
on the whale and at 6 a.m. finished
cutting and set the works again at
4 p.m. 4 whales in sight. So ends this day.
Lat. 36-30 Long. 74.00

Sund. 11 This day comes in with a fine
breeze from the S. E. Steaming to the
Eastward with all sail on in company
with 3 whales. At noon went on
board of a 4 masted bound to N. Y.
and sent letters and at 3 p.m.
raised whales lowered and the
larboard boat struck and turned over
the waist boat struck the whale and
came alongside and hooked on
to him at 6 p.m. and the cutting
stage rope fixed it up and cut in
the whale. So ends this day.
