This day comes in moderate at 7 a.m. Saw Golden City with boats down. This saw him later a whale Latter part the same.

July 1 Day comes in fine with wind to the Eastward. Swift and S. City in sight Latter part wind to the Southward.

2

Day begins squally wind S. S. St. at 7 P.m. cleared off fine.

3

Fine weather wind to the Westward.

July 4 Day begins with a fine breeze from the S.E. Run to the Southward and Westward all day.

5

Day begins fine light breeze to the Southward at 5 a.m. raised whales gave chase and struck one on the head iron did not go in E. B. Bonnell got two S.m. lowered again and got one came alongside and cut him in and started the works going.

Thurs. July

6

This day comes in fine wind from the Southward. Raised whales lowered and got one came alongside and made out for the night.

Fri. 7

Day comes in fine wind from the Southward at 4 a.m. looked on to the whale and at 7 a.m. finished cutting. Boiling and working on it.

Sat. 8

Day moderate wind from the Southward boiling.

Sun. 9

This day comes in fine breeze from the S. St. at 10 a.m. saw E. B. with boats down. Then raised whales lowered and got one came alongside and cut it. Sent letters by Steamer.

Mon. 10

Day wind Southly saw whales boiling.

Tues. 11

This day fine weather. Raised whales lowered and hauled struck and got store and lost the whale. Boat came alongside boiling. Raised more whales at 4 p.m. lowered but to late. Fresh breeze.

Wed. 12

Day fine weather. Gained Bonnell and Gampson.

Thurs. 13

This day fine Swift and Bonnell in sight wind Southly.

Fri. 14

This day moderate. Broke four gaff. Raised whales lowered and got two and lost one. came alongside and cut them in and finished cutting at 9 p.m.

Sat. 15

Fresh S. St. wind and rough boiling. Gained the Swift at 6 p.m.
