Fri. 18<sup>th</sup> This day comes in with a fresh breeze from the S. E. raised whales lowered and got two came alongside and cut in the bay of one whale and left the head for skimming.

So ends this day.

Sat. 19<sup>th</sup> This day comes in moderate and rainy hooked on to the head and took it in and then hooked on to the other whale and cut him in latter part fresh breeze from the S. E. raised more whales but did not lower. Put John Ambrose in Boat. Skinner again to give him another trial.

So ends this day.

Sun. 20<sup>th</sup> This day begins with a fresh North East Wind all employed in working on oil. Latter part more moderate.

So ends this day.

Mon. 21<sup>st</sup> This day begins with a light breeze from the North East raised a school of whales lowered and the last boat John Ambrose Boat. Skinner went up alongside of a whale and raised him. The Starboard boat struck out and then the Starboard boat struck out brought them alongside and then the Starboard boat struck another came alongside and made fast for the night. Broke John Ambrose and put him in Water Left and put Fred Davis in Boat. Skinner. So ends this day.

Tue. 22<sup>nd</sup> This day comes with a light breeze from the N. East crew all employed in working on oil. Latter part the same. So ends this day.

Wed. 23<sup>rd</sup> This day begins with a light breeze from the N. East. Fresh whales lowered and the last boat got two and got stove and the Starboard boat got one and got stove came alongside and made fast for the night. So ends this day.

Thur. 24<sup>th</sup> This day comes in with a calm. At 4 a.m. hooked on to the whales and began to cut. Finished cutting and went to work on the heads. Latter part light breeze from the S. E.

So ends this day.

Fri. 25<sup>th</sup> This day comes in with a light breeze from the Starboard crew all working on oil. Latter part the same. So ends this day.

Sat. 26<sup>th</sup> This day comes in with a fresh breeze from the S. E. at 11.30 a.m. finished working crew employed in stowing down oil. Latter part the same. So ends this day.

Sun. 27<sup>th</sup> This day comes in with a fresh breeze from the Northward. Latter part the same. So ends this day.

Mon. 28<sup>th</sup> This day comes in with a light wind from the Northward squally and rainy also a snow. So ends this day.

Tue. 29<sup>th</sup> This day begins with a heavy gale from the North carried away the fore top sail vessel under very short sail. Latter part more moderate.

So ends this day.

Wed. 30<sup>th</sup> This day begins with a light breeze from the North at 8 a.m. went out first of a 4 masted schooner and sent letters and at 1 p.m. passed the C. H. Morgan of New Bedford took in sail at sunset. So ends this day. At 9.30 p.m. whales around.

Thur. 31<sup>st</sup> This day comes in with a fresh S. E. Westerly breeze running to the Eastward in company with the C. H. Morgan one other whaling ship in sight and 4 5 masted. Latter part the same. So ends this day.
