Wednesday, Oct. 6. 1886. Lat. 27.30. Long. 53.37

P.M. Employed at the same. Sunset wind light from the Southward. Ship by the wind on the Port tack. Middle and latter part moderate South winds. Employed generally making spungarn &

Thursday, Oct. 7. 1886.

P.M. Wind working to the Eastward. Sunset by the wind on the Port tack heading S.W. A number of sails seen during the day. Middle and latter part light Easterly winds. Have been employed at Ship's duty.

Friday, Oct. 8. 1886. No Observation

P.M. Employed the same. Sunset by the wind on the Port tack. Heading to the Southward. Nothing seen. Middle and latter part light Easterly winds. Employed at Ship's duty.

Saturday, Oct. 9. 1886. Lat. 24.34. Long. 53.42

P.M. Wind working to the Southward went round on the Starboard tack heading to the Eastward. One sail in sight. Latter part light South winds. Employed at Ship's duty.

Sunday, Oct. 10. 1886. Lat. 24.45. Long. 53.49

P.M. No change. At work in the rigging. Sunset on the Starboard tack by the wind. Nothing in sight. Middle and latter part light winds from the Southward. All hands reabing. To day Benten Joseph went below off duty sick with a disease contracted at home.

Monday, Oct. 11. 1886. No Observation

P.M. At 6.00 got a strong South wind stored all light sail. Sunset moderated again made all sail again. On the same tack by the wind. Nothing in sight. Middle and latter part squally weather. Had a heavy thunder squall at ten with rain in everything.

Tuesday, Oct. 12. 1886. No Observation

P.M. Moderate South winds with rain. Sunset set the Main top gallant sail & Flying jib wind from the same quarter. Nothing in sight. Middle and latter part squally weather from the Southward. Saw a number of sails bound to the S.W.

Wednesday, Oct. 13. 1886. No Observation

P.M. Weather the same squally. Sunset by the wind on the Starboard tack under topsails. Nothing in sight. Middle and latter part strong South winds. Ship by the wind on the Starboard tack.

Thursday, Oct. 14. 1886. Lat. 27.18. No Longitude

P.M. Blowing strong. Had to set up rigging forward. Sunset strong winds. Nothing in sight. Middle and latter part strong winds from the Southward everything in belt down in main topsail.

Friday, Oct. 15. 1886. Lat. 28.45. Long. 57.34

P.M. Moderating some. Sunset on the Eastern tack Main top gallant sail out. Employed setting up Main topmast shrouds. Middle and latter part strong South winds with heavy squalls of rain.
