^{Friday} Tuesday, Nov. 5, 1886. Lat. 04.28. Long. 31.24.

X P.M. Weather the same. At last have got a fair wind from S.W. Steering S.E. One sail in sight steering same way. To day has been busy went off duty work. Middle and latter part strong breeze from S.E. Employed repairing rigging and furling.

^{Saturday} Wednesday, Nov. 6, 1886. Lat. 03.57. Long. 31.37

X P.M. Employed the same. Sunset on the Western tack by the wind. One sail in sight. Middle and latter part light winds with squalls. Employed generally.

Thursday, Nov. 7, 1886. Lat. 02.22. Long. 31.37

X P.M. Had a large English ship steering N.W. Sunset by the wind heading to the Southward. Latter part a hard rain storm wind from the Southward. Saw a white water could not make it out.

Friday, Nov. 8, 1886. Lat. 01.03. Long. 31.41.

P.M. Clear weather, wind ahead. Made a number of tacks during the day. Sunset by the wind heading to the South & West. Middle and latter part strong South winds. Employed setting up Foretopmast backstay.

Saturday, Nov. 9, 1886. Lat. 00.47. South. Long. 31.56

P.M. Strong south winds. Past a steamer steering S.W. Sunset equally furled some light sail. Hoisting S.W. by P. Middle and latter part strong winds from S.E. Employed making spungers.

Remarks made on board. Master.

Wednesday, Nov. 10, 1886. Lat. 13.00. Long. 31.26

P.M. Employed the same. Sunset heading South. Past a steamer going North. Middle and latter part strong South wind. Employed making spungers.

Thursday, Nov. 11, 1886. Lat. 03.27. Long. 31.17

P.M. Past a number of sails bound to the Northward. Sunset went round heading to the Eastward. Middle and latter part strong S.E. winds. Employed at ship's duty making spungers.

Friday, Nov. 12, 1886. Lat. 02.24. Long. 31.24

P.M. Employed at the same. Sunset on the Eastern tack by the wind. One sail in sight steering same way. Middle and latter part strong winds. Have been employed generally.

Saturday, Nov. 13, 1886. Lat. 04.32. Long. 32.45

P.M. Strong winds. Sunset one sail in sight bound same way. Nothing seen from windward. Middle and latter part strong winds. Daylight sighted the Island of Fernando Noronha ahead. At seven kept off and past to leeward of it.

Sunday, Nov. 14, 1886. Lat. 06.19. Long. 33.44

P.M. Strong winds. Lost sight of the land. Sunset on the Western tack by the wind. Middle and latter part strong winds are working to windward tack and tack. A number of sails in sight bound same way.
