

Remarks made on board Park. Wm Baylies

Monday. 15. 1856. Lat. 38.00. Long. 34.37

P.M. Wind the same. Sunset went round again heading to the South & West. Middle and latter part light winds. Sunrise rose the land off the beam Cape St. Augustine bearing S.W. distant twenty miles.

Tuesday Nov. 16. 1856. Lat. 10.40. Long. 34.45.

P.M. Wind light. Have been employed at ship duty. Sunset. Land in sight off to leeward. And one sail. Middle and latter part strong winds. Steering S by W. the light fair wind for fifty. Have been employed generally.

Wednesday. Nov. 17. 1856. Lat. 13.12. Long. 34.45.

P.M. One sail in sight steering same way. Sunset steering the same. Good winds from S.E. Middle and latter part moderate winds. Employed in the rigging.

Thursday. Nov. 18. 1856. Lat. 16.03. Long. 34.45.

P.M. Steering S by W. Sunset the same. Two sails in sight steering same way. Middle and latter part light winds from S.E. Have been employed to day breaking out water and setting up rigging.

Friday. Nov. 19. 1856. No Observation

P.M. Employed the same. Rose a large white matter but could not make it out. Sunset steering S by W. Middle and latter part light winds. Employed setting up rigging. At the lowered for a school of S.P. Whales and got four. Two to the W.B. One to the B.B. and one to the P.B. Boat lost by iron paring

Saturday. Nov. 20. 1856. Lat. 17.25. Long. 35.20

P.M. Breezing. Returned on board at dark. Will not to morning. Middle and latter part strong winds with squalls of rain. Commenced to not at daylight got all through at noon.

Sunday. Nov. 21. 1856. Lat. 15.36. Long. 35.30

P.M. Employed clearing away heads. Kelt off S.P. Middle and latter part moderate winds employed boiling.

Monday. Nov. 22. 1856. No Observation

P.M. Calm. Sunset a light air steering S.W. Boiling. Middle and latter part moderate winds got through boiling at daylight.

Tuesday. Nov. 23. 1856. No Observation

P.M. Employed setting up main rigging. Sunset more wind. Steering S.W. Middle and latter part strong winds. Have been stowing down (1214) gallons of S.P. oil

Wednesday. Nov. 24. 1856. Lat. 23.11. Long. 35.23

P.M. Raining some. Finished stowing down at five. Sunset steering S.W. Middle part had a sudden shift of wind from S.E. to S.P.W. raining hard. Stowed all light sail. Latter part strong winds.

Thursday. Nov. 25. 1856. Lat. 23.34. Long. 35.28

P.M. Strong winds. Two sails in sight. Sunset moderating some made all sail. Land went round heading to the Westward Middle and latter part strong winds. Have been employed setting up rigging aft.
