

Remarks made on board Tark. Wm Dayless

Sunday, Dec. 19, 1886. Lat. 57.55. Long. 62.57.

P.M. Calm. Employed washing ship inside. Sunset no wind. Land in sight of broken hills and distant Middle part lost sight of the Falkland steering S.P.W. Daylight kept off S.W. Wind North

Monday, Dec. 20, 1886. Lat. 57.45. Long. 63.30

P.M. Strong winds from the same quarter. Sunset steering S.E. all sail set. Latter part rose Staten Island ahead steering South. (90) days out. Took the boat and mast boat in to day.

Tuesday, Dec. 21, 1886. Lat. 55.50. Long. 63.50

P.M. Wind moderating and working more to the Westward. Sunset land off weather beam distant ten miles. Ship on the Starboard tack by the wind Middle and latter part strong Westerly winds. Staten Island in sight bearing W.N.W.

Wednesday, Dec. 22, 1886. Lat. 55.24. Long. 64.35

P.M. Wind increasing from the same quarter in all light sail. Sunset by the wind on the port tack heading to the North West. Middle and latter part equally weather from the Westward. Fore the Flying jib sent it in for repairs.

Thursday, Dec. 23, 1886. Lat. 55.50. Long. 64.10.

P.M. Calm. Sunset a North wind steering S.W. Cape Horn in sight. One sail steering same way. Middle part steering S.W. Wind North. At three had a sudden shift of wind to the S.W. and blowing with great violence

Friday, Dec. 24, 1886. Lat. 56.55. Long. 66.02

P.M. Wind moderating some. Sunset Ship on the Starboard tack heading to the Eastward Middle and latter part strong S.W. winds.

Saturday, Dec. 25, 1886. No Observation

P.M. Wind working to the Northward and raining. Sunset steering S.W. half W. Land in sight off weather beam. Middle and latter part light weather. Wind W by N.

Sunday, Dec. 26, 1886. Lat. 56.41. Long. 67.08

P.M. Blowing a heavy gale from S.P.W. nothing out but lower main topsail. One sail in sight. Midnight gale moderating. Latter part calm.

Monday, Dec. 27, 1886. No Observation

P.M. At two got a light air from the N.E. Sunset gradually increasing. Steering W.P.W. One sail in sight bound to the Eastward. Middle part part the Island of Diego Ramirez of Cape Horn steering W.P.W. Wind North.

Tuesday, Dec. 28, 1886. Lat. 56.52. Long. 71.21

P.M. Wind working to the Westward. Sunset by the wind heading to the Northward. One sail in sight steering same way. Middle part blowing a gale of wind from the Westward. Latter part moderating.

Wednesday, Dec. 29, 1886. Lat. 57.18. Long. 71.48

P.M. At noon wore Ship heading to the South West. Sunset wind the same and strong. Middle and latter part frequent squalls from the Westward
