

Remarks made on board, Bark, *Wm Bayliss*

Monday, Apr. 4, 1847.

P.M. Got a breeze from the Eastward steered in to the land, but could not make it out. Sunset made Kobuk Island and kept off for Oumimuk passage. Latter sent a line. Sent three boats a fishing and out with poor success.

Tuesday, Apr. 5, 1847. No Observation

P.M. Calm. Sunset in Oumimuk passage with no wind. Middle's part got a light breeze from the Northward came through the passage all night. Daylight sent two boats a fishing.

Wednesday, Apr. 6, 1847. No Observation

P.M. Made all sail and kept off N.W. Sea Breeze in night steering same way. Sunset wind increasing and thick. Middle's part made the ice so came to the wind on the Southern tack under short sail. Daylight kept off again W. steering through thin ice.

Thursday, Apr. 7, 1847. No Observation

P.M. Wind increasing from the N.E. and snowing hard. Sunset in all sail steering the same. Middle's part strong wind from the N.E. and snowing hard. Daylight came to the wind heading N.W. W.

Friday, Apr. 8, 1847. No Observation

P.M. No change in the weather. Snowing some. Steering the same. Latter part came to the wind heading to the Northward. Wind N.E. and snowing.

Saturday, Apr. 9, 1847. Lat. 58.00. Long. 178.00. East

P.M. Still snowing. Wind the same. Sunset a moderate N.E. wind. Ship on the same tack by the wind. Middle's and latter part strong N.E. wind with snow.

Sunday, Apr. 10, 1847. No Observation

P.M. Strong strong winds. Sunset in upper top sail. Ship heading to the North & West. Middle and latter part strong N.W. winds with snow.

Monday, Apr. 11, 1847. Lat. 59.30. Long. 178.12. E

P.M. The same strong winds. Latter part moderating some. White sail working to the Northward tack and tack.

Tuesday, Apr. 12, 1847. No Observation

P.M. Strong winds again with plenty of scattering ice. Sunset on the port tack by the wind. Latter part made the park ice also spoke Bark Reindier.

Wednesday, Apr. 13, 1847. No Observation

P.M. Working along the ice to the Northward. Reindier in sight. Latter part working through ice.

Thursday, Apr. 14, 1847. No Observation

P.M. Sailing Bark Reindier. Wind N.E. and snowing. Middle's and latter part light winds. Have been working through ice.
