

Remarks made on board. Bark Wm. Bayliss

Saturday June 11. 1857

P.M. Still to see anchor trailing. Calm no wind. Middle and latter part at anchor off Indian Point.

Sunday June 12. 1857

P.M. At fair took our departure trailing to the Northward & Eastward. Shipped first natives for the season. All of the other ships also got underway.

Monday June 13. 1857

P.M. Moderate North wind stood in towards the land and made round at six heading off shore. Brought to anchoring & Carvetia in sight. Latter part a snow storm and light North wind. Kept off South at ten.

Tuesday June 14. 1857

P.M. Clear weather. Looked for a Whale at six o'clock going quick to the Northward on a run to get him. Sunset land in sight distant ten miles. Midnight kept off for Indian Point steering S.W. Latter part carried off the point found a number of ships at anchor.

Wednesday June 15. 1857

P.M. Kept off P.E. in company with Bark Lancer. Saw the S. Greenland whaling got nothing. Land in sight distant twelve miles bearing West. Latter part moderate weather a number of ships in sight but no whales.

Coraxi Montrose Master
Thursday June 16. 1857

P.M. Standing in towards the land. Running in Bark Wm. Whistle and latter part steering off the Northward. Employed to day getting the sails on for a Starboard Run boat.

Friday June 17. 1857

P.M. Steering North in company with Bark Wm. Mar. Ke. Lancer & Wm. Land in sight. At ten for Kings Island at seven latter part. Past the Diamond at noon. Wind S.E. and light.

Saturday June 18. 1857

P.M. Steering S.E. Rose Kings Island at four P.M. and plenty of ice came to the mind at ten (midnight) heading S.W. Latter part steering S.W. Nothing in sight but saw Wind East and light.

Sunday June 19. 1857

P.M. Employed on Starboard Run boat. From two o'clock running down river unknown. Middle and latter part steering in towards St. Lawrence Bay in company with Bark Wm. Phoenix.

Monday June 20. 1857

P.M. Looked for a Whale going quick did not get him. Young Phoenix looked got nothing. Kept off again N.W. Land ahead distant ten miles. Came to anchor in St. Lawrence Bay at ten latter part. Sent on shore a salt of racks for water Young Phoenix anchored same time.
