

Remarks made on board Dr Wm Day's

Monday Feb 20: 1888 Lat 22-16 Long 149-23
P.M. got work on on various jobs
wind hauled back into the N.East.
ship heading N.West. and remained so
all night. Making the same sounds

Tuesday Feb 21: 1888 Lat 23-30 Long 141-33½
P.M. Hooper & Engleover repaired the
spare boat wing at North ship heading
West North West at dark during the night
wind hauled to southerly course N.W.
in order to clear Sulphur Island at
day break raised St. Augustine on our
starboard beam hauled over course to the
North-East. at ten A.M. Sulphur Island bore
S.S. East. shaped our course to clear
St. Alessandro fifteen miles N.W. East at
twelve came North North-East. sounds

Wednesday Feb 22: 1888 No Observation
P.M. strong wind from the south
at two o'clock St. Alessandro bore West by S.
hauled to the course North by East at
half past wind hauled to the N.East
in a squall. at three o'clock heading
East & East South-East. blowing heavily
at five wind blowing heavily with a
risky sea running during the night
the wind moderate and day break fine
weather made all sail. heading N.West
luffed up to North at 12 St. Augustine
two points on lee beam. so ends

Thursday Feb 23: 1888 No Observation
P.M. at one the wind began to
raise during the rest of the day
squally. at dark strong wind
heading N.W. West at four the
wind began to moderate at 12 a dead
calm. at three breeze sprang up
from the North East morning fine
mild wind. hands employed in ship duty

Friday Feb 24: 1888 Lat 24-8 Long 141-7
P.M. hands employed at ship's duty
Cooper at work coppering the yards
Captain Montrose is well
night moderate winds. morning a fresh
breeze blowing hard at work
at Reep & Port began to wash ship.
breeze freshening so at nine o'clock
were ship heading N.West under
short sail head yards aback so ends

Saturday Feb 25: 1888 No Observation
P.M. blowing hard at three blowing
a heavy gale of wind at seven
it began to moderate until it
was quite calm morning very
light wings with rain squall
so ends.

Sunday Feb 26: 1888 Lat 27-35 Long 141-19
P.M. breeze sprang up at four o'clock
heading South East by East Reep her
on that course until ten o'clock
hove to on short tack the rest of
the night at half past six in the
morning Reep her off East at half
past seven raised Reep Island right
ahead at noon Port Layed bore East
four miles. Were ship under short sail
so ends this day

Monday Feb 27: 1888
P.M. at getting Anchors & chains
ready for Anchoring at half
past one were ship and stood in
to Port Layed at 20 minutes past
four dropped our anchor. at half past
the Doctor's boat came aboard. As aally
during the night morning at repairing
sails. Christopher McConnell is very sick.
not expected to live.
