

Remarks made onboard Sk Wm Daylio.

Friday July 6th 1888

P.M. Hands employed in ships duty - running along the shore ice to the north at three P.M. off Cape Lisbon at four hours to on the starboard tack middle and latter part worked to the south at nine A.M. saw a bow head and lowered four boats did not get him so ends

Saturday July 7th 1888.

P.M. Hands employed in washing ship working to the south at three a calm at six P.M. wind sprang up from the North Course S-S-W at ten P.M. finished washing at five A.M. hauled to the S.E. at six saw two ships whaling wind gradually backing to the South found three in sight also one Stener and one sailing ship so ends

Sunday July 8th 1888

P.M. Hands employed in working ship at two P.M. dropped anchor at Point Hope two vessels also at anchor middle and latter part the same so ends

Monday July 9th 1888.

P.M. Hands employed in ships duty at four P.M. took our anchor and stood to the North two Steners in sight to the South a calm worked to the North during the middle part of the day at eight A.M. kept off for Point Hope at eleven part eleven dropped our anchor

Tuesday July 10th 1888

P.M. Hands employed in ships duty at four P.M. Capt. Montross went aboard the Herald of four vessels were at anchor wind at North middle and latter part the same so ends

Wednesday July 11th 1888

P.M. still at anchor at nine P.M. took anchor and stood to the North at ten the wind fell away calm middle and latter part worked to the south so ends

Thursday July 12th 1888

P.M. hands employed in ships duty at seven P.M. off the end of Point Hope eight ships in sight wind at North at eight P.M. lowered for whaler got no hauls again at five A.M. did not get any at anchor at the Point Hope sound

Friday July 13th 1888

P.M. this day begins with a light North wind eight vessels at anchor and several working up from the south still at anchor middle and latter part the same

Saturday July 14th 1888

P.M. Hands employed in ships duty lowered for whaler did not get any a calm middle and latter part the same

Sunday July 15th 1888

P.M. Hands employed in ships duty wind at North middle and latter part the same at anchor some paper here

Monday July 16th 1888

Hands employed in working bow secured our barrel from the Tundra and got our potatoes and other provisions on board and freetied around to the north of the Point wind at South East so ends
