

Remarks made onboard Bk N^o Baylis

Tuesday July 17 1888

P.M. Hands employed in ship's duty
bound to the North wind at east - at
two A.M. wind hauled to the North
Cape Liston fifteen miles off bearing S.E. by E.
20 ends

Wednesday July 18 1888

P.M. Hands employed in Ship's duty
a thick fog wind hauled to the
eastward Cape Liston eight miles off bearing
South middle and latter part of the day
a calm 20 ends

Thursday July 19 1888

P.M. Hands employed in ship's duty -
at half past twelve dropped our anchor
at one took it again - a light wind
from the west-ward at seven P.M. coal
mines, five miles off quite a number
of ships in sight at two A.M. dropped
our anchor at the Coal Vase one boat-ward
ashore and returned with a load of coal
20 ends

Friday July 20 1888

P.M. Hands employed in digging coal
got two loads wind at South
blowing hard middle and latter part
of the day the same

Saturday July 21 1888

P.M. Hands employed in ship's duty
Wind at South with rain several ships
have got under weigh and gone to the
North at eight P.M. wind quite much
at eleven P.M. wind very light with
rain at twelve one watch went ashore
to dig coal latter part the same
20 ends

Sunday July 22 1888

P.M. Hands employed in digging coal
wind at North very light with fog
middle and latter part the same
20 ends

Monday July 23 1888

P.M. Still at anchor Hands employed in
boating coal wind at South East
middle and latter part the same

Tuesday July 24 1888

P.M. Still at anchor Hands employed
in getting our water at ten P.M.
got one raft onboard wind very light
from the Eastward latter part calm
until eight A.M. it breezed up
very quick from the South East
got a raft of Cask on board had to
take them in again 20 ends

Wednesday July 25 1888

P.M. Hands employed in stowing
cask below wind at South blowing very
hard two ships got under weigh
bound to the North one Steamer and
the Lagoda at anchor with us
at half past ten the wind fell away
calm I sent a raft of Cask ashore for
water got three rafts during the day
a calm 20 ends

Thursday July 26 1888

P.M. Hands employed in stowing cask
for water a calm with fog glamed
the Sk Lagoda at four A.M. took our
anchor and stood to the N.E. 20 ends
