

Remarks made onboard *Blk Wm Daphn*

Sunday Aug 5 1888

P.M. Hands employed in Ship's duty - wind has hauled into the N East - some of vessels have fleet to the South of the point - Steamers have brought the Young Phenix & Fleeting Crew here middle part strong breeze from the eastward, latter part from the South at eight A.M. the *Blk Wm Daphn* dropped anchor close by *se ends*

Monday Aug 6 1888

P.M. At Anchor off Point Barrow at two P.M. took anchor and dropped around to the North side of the Point - *Blk Rounder* ~~dropped~~ fly bit from the cutter run into her middle and latter part - the same *se ends*

Tuesday Aug 7 1888

P.M. At three o'clock took our anchor and run to the eastward and made and anchored again - hands employed in Ship's duty at eight A.M. took anchor and worked to the eastward *se ends*

Wednesday Aug 8 1888

P.M. Hands employed in Ship's duty - working Ship to the eastward wind at East - six Ships in sight - worked to the middle part at eight A.M. kept off to the eastward *se ends*

Thursday Aug 8 1888

P.M. Hands employed in Ship's duty - gunnery Lt. Lancer A Hicks and schooner *Jas Danville* - at six P.M. dropped anchor, at eight A.M. took our anchor and stood to the westward at *se ends*

Friday Aug 10 1888

P.M. Hands employed in Ship's duty - one ship ~~working~~ the *Blk Hunt* - got one whale at one P.M. bore Ship and layed atack on the eastern tack, at three A.M. kept of N.E. run down off Cape Hallett - land bore to - on the North tack eighteen Ships in sight middle to latter part the same.

Saturday Aug 11 1888

P.M. Working to the eastward at six P.M. dropped anchor - at six A.M. took it again - and run to the eastward five ships in sight - hands employed - Bending Sails

Sunday Aug 12 1888

P.M. Hands employed in Ship's duty at four P.M. dropped anchor - a thick fog Capt. Rade came onboard at ten P.M. the wind hauled to the N East - at eight A.M. took anchor and run to the westward *se ends*

Monday Aug 13 1888

P.M. Hands employed in Ship's duty - ten ships in sight - at three o'clock dropped anchor off Cape Hallett - the Capt. went aboard of the *Blk Hunt* - at eight broke up the game at one A.M. the wind hauled to the westward at eight A.M. took our anchor and worked to the westward *se ends*

Tuesday Aug 14 1888

P.M. Hands employed in Ship's duty at half past three anchored a flat calm with rain at four P.M. dropped anchor again at six A.M. took it again and run to the westward wind at N.E. *se ends*
