

Remarks made onboard Bk Wm Baylis

Wednesday Aug 15-1888
P.M. Hands employed at Ships duty - a calm and a thick fog at one P.M. dropped anchor at eight took it again and worked to the westward at ten P.M. dropped anchor wind at west with rain so ends

Thursday Aug 16-1888
P.M. Hands at work making a main-royal at one P.M. it died away calm but from a light air springing up from the NE at six P.M. took out anchor and run to the westward opened the Anderson Hicks chain Ships in sight at ten ended the day hauled to the N.W. so ends

Friday Aug 17-1888
P.M. at three kept off for the Point Barrow from there sighted also six sailing vessels at one A.M. dropped anchor at the Ducking Station. the V. Ship Thetis and sixteen vessels are here also at nine A.M. Capt. Mantou went onboard Thetis so ends

Saturday Aug 18-1888
P.M. Hands employed in Ships duty wind light from the South middle part the same, at eight A.M. took anchor and run to the eastward ten miles and anchored again so ends

Sunday Aug 19-1888
P.M. Hands employed in Ships duty wind at N.W. middle part the same at six A.M. took anchor and run to the eastward eight Ships in sight so ends

Monday Aug 20-1888
P.M. Hands employed in Ships duty at one Capt. Mantou went onboard the Brig Hidalgo at nine P.M. dropped anchor at ten broke up the gale wind at South at six A.M. took anchor and run to the eastward hauled to the wind at nine A.M. so ends

Tuesday Aug 21-1888
P.M. Hands employed in Ships duty wind at west - four Ships in sight - working ships to the westward middle and calm part the same.

Wednesday Aug 22-1888
P.M. Hands employed in Ships duty wind west at daylight three Ships in sight - working to the westward middle and calm part wind from the east & East so ends

Thursday Aug 23-1888
P.M. Hands employed in Ships duty wind at S.E. at ten P.M. dropped anchor at the Ducking Station at three A.M. took it again and stood to the S.W. wind at N.W. so ends

Friday Aug 24-1888
P.M. Hands employed in Ships duty working to the westward wind at west - four Ships in sight at seven P.M. Ships position to W of Point Barrow blowing fresh worked to the S.W. during the middle part at eight A.M. anchored in four fathoms of water - N.E. of the Point - so ends this day.
