

Remarks made onboard *OK Wm Daykin*

Saturday Aug 25. 1888

P.M. Hands employed in Ship's duty. wind at west-ice working inshore at five P.M. floated in-shore in four & greater fathoms at half past one the ship went ashore in two fathoms of water. latter part the same ice coming in shore fast - so ends

Sunday Aug 26. 1888

P.M. At one o'clock. run our Starboard anchor ashore - with a haysen to it and took our port bow out on the quarter - also a kedge. wind at N.W. moderating a little and hauling to the westward. at four A.M. hoisted colors for assistance and started to light. Ship at six A.M. had the ship afloat in three fathoms of water - the rest of the day at water kedgeing ship to the westward.

Monday Aug 27. 1888

P.M. took out Starboard anchor and sent it to the cable again. the Officers of the other ships left at three P.M. Middle layed at anchor at six A.M. started to kedge the wind at west - at eleven A.M. stopped so ends

Tuesday Aug 28 1888

P.M. took ketch and kedge and made sail and worked to the Point Barrow at nine o'clock anchored abreast of the Settlement and layed the ship the rest of the day at nine A.M. four steamers came to anchor so ends

Wednesday Aug 29 1888

P.M. Ship at anchor at three o'clock the *Str Balema* took anchor and steamed to the eastward a calm. at five the wind sprang up from the N.E. middle part layed at anchor. at seven A.M. took our anchor and run around to the west-side of Point Barrow so ends

Thursday Aug 30 1888

P.M. Hands employed in rearing of cutting falls and getting sand from shore wind at N.E. blowing very hard at two A.M. two ships got under weigh and run to the S.W. at eight A.M. took our anchor and steamed S.W. in company with *OK Hunter* so ends

Friday Aug 31 1888

P.M. Hands employed in Ship's duty wind at east comes S.W. at one raised two ships on our port bow. wind is moderating at seven a calm and fog at ten the wind sprang up from the East grandly working to the South at six P.M. wind at S.W. so ends

Saturday September 1 1888

P.M. Hands employed in Ship's duty wind at W.S.W. at seven P.M. it moderated and hauled to the North at six A.M. a calm at eight A.M. wind sprang up from the East and hands at work taking the anchors on the Bow so ends

Sunday September 2 1888

P.M. Hands employed in Ship's duty wind at East - two ships in sight middle and latter part the same so ends this day.
