

Remarks made on board *Dr. W. Day's*

Monday Sept. 3 1888

P.M. Hands employed in Ship's duty. I ammed the Dr. W. Day's boat and lowered for whales at eight P.M. did not get any middle and fall part of the day wind light from the Eastward so ends.

Tuesday Sept. 4 1888

P.M. At five o'clock raised a pod of Whales. lowered all boats and Waist-boat got one took the whales along side at four P.M. finished cutting at six middle part light wind from the south west at day light lowered for whales did not get any so ends this day.

Wednesday Sept. 5 1888

P.M. At one o'clock lowered all boats for a whale did not get any at six P.M. wind from the westward I ammed the Dr. W. Day's boat. Dicks middle and fall part the same wind at North Hour strong so ends.

Thursday Sept. 6 1888

P.M. lowered for whales did not get any at six o'clock started the works middle part calm at two A.M. wind sprang up from the North at six A.M. blowing strong six Ships two Ships lowered for whales did not get any. so ends this day.

Friday Sept. 7 1888

P.M. at one o'clock lowered for whales did not get any middle part light wind from the South East at three A.M. finished boiling at six started to break out main holt and stow down our oil so ends this day.

Horace Montross Master -

Saturday September 8 1888

P.M. Hands at work running down oil at three finished wind at S.E. course west North west seen Ships in sight at seven P.M. a thick fog and remained so during the night at eight A.M. it cleared up at nine o'clock rose a whale did not lower going quick to the windward so ends.

Sunday September 9 1888

P.M. Hands employed in Ship's duty Ship running along the ice to the S.E. mine Ships in sight wind at N.E. at ten in full calm at one A.M. wind sprang up from the North and remained so the rest of the day.

Monday September 10 1888

P.M. Hands employed in Ship's duty Ship in sight wind at North course S. West - ran along the ice to the westward at day hauled in the N.W. wind at N.E. East so ends.

Tuesday September 11 1888

P.M. Hands employed in Ship's duty Ship heading West North west seen Ships in sight middle part the same at eleven A.M. lowered for whales did not get any so ends this day.

Wednesday September 12 1888

P.M. At nine o'clock boats came on board lashed with the headyards aback during the night at eight A.M. lowered for whales at twelve o'clock boats came on board so ends this day.
