 Begins with thick and squally weather with moderate breeze from the N. at sundown wind increasing middle and latter part strong breeze and heavy swell from the N. all hands employed in ship's duty Friday March 29th 1889
- Lat 50.25 Lon 165.25 Begins with fresh breeze and heavy swell from the N. with snow squalls steering N. N. E. middle and latter part wind increasing and veering to the N. under lower main topsail and storm staysails.
- Lat 51.25 Lon 166.10 Saturday March 30th 1889
 Begins with gale from the N. N. W. with heavy snow squalls middle and latter part wind moderating heavy swell from the N. under short sail all hands employed in ship's duty.
- Lat 52.14 Lon 167.15 Sunday March 31st 1889
 Begins with calm and cloudy weather with heavy swell from the N. middle and latter part wind increasing from the N. E. N. E. N. E.
