 Begins with light breeze from the W. with
 thick weather working to the eastward along
 the ice middle part the same three vessels
 in sight clear weather latter part the same
 Lat 58.30 Lon 172.31 Friday May 17th 1889
 Begins with light breeze from the S.W.
 clear weather several vessels in sight working
 to the N.E. along the ice middle and latter
 part the same
 Lat 60.10 Lon 171.50 Saturday May 18th 1889
 Begins with light breeze from the S.E. with
 thick weather and snow steering to the North
 and east along the ice middle part the same
 latter part several vessels in sight
 Lat 60.50 Lon 170.40 Sunday May 19th 1889
 Begins with light breeze from the N.W. with
 thick weather middle and latter part
 cloudy with partially clear weather several
 vessels in sight working to the North
 Lat 60.44 Lon 171.00 Monday May 20th 1889
 Begins with clear weather with breeze
 from the North at 5.30 raised Nunivak
 island bearing East distant about 25 miles
 working toward the North middle part the
 same several vessels in sight latter
 part the same working through heavy ice
 Lat 61.06 Lon 167.10 Tuesday May 21st
 Begins with clear weather and fresh
 breeze from the North working to the North
 in clear water along the ice middle and
 latter part thick weather
 Wednesday May 22nd 1889
 Begins with thick weather and strong breeze
 from the N.W. working to the westward
 Cape Romanoff middle part clear Cape Romanoff in sight
 bearing E distant about 10 miles latter
 part thick weather working to the N.W.

Thursday May 23rd 1889
 Begins with thick weather and wind from the
 North working to the N.E. through ice Cape
 Romanoff bearing East distant about 30 miles
 middle and latter part the same
 Lat 62.24 Lon 167.15 Friday May 24th 1889
 Begins with wind from the north with thick
 weather working to the N.W. middle part
 the same at 2 P.M. kept off steering to the South
 and west latter part the same
 Lat 61.50 Lon 168.00 Saturday May 25th 1889
 Begins with light breeze from the North with
 thick weather middle part partially clear several
 vessels in sight working in heavy ice middle
 part the same latter part thick
 Lat 62.30 Lon 167.10 Sunday May 26th 1889
 Begins with thick weather with light
 breeze from the N.E. working to the N.W. middle
 part spoke the Sea Breeze latter part wind went
 steering N.W.
 Lat Monday May 27th 1889
 Begins with light breeze from the S.W. with
 partially clear weather several vessels in sight
 working to the Westward through scattering ice
 middle and latter part the same
 At Lawrence Island Tuesday May 28th 1889
 Begins with light breeze from the S.W.
 working to the N.W. clear water several
 vessels and devil fish in sight at 2 P.M.
 raised St. Lawrence Island bearing E by N
 distant about 20 miles latter part the same
 Plover Bay Wednesday May 29th 1889
 Begins with wind from the N.W. with thick weather
 middle part the same West Head of Plover Bay
 bearing N distant about 3 miles latter part
 the same several vessels in sight
 Thursday May 30th 1889
 Begins with clear weather and light wind W.
 middle part the same working along the land
 to the West saw two whales latter part wind W.
 weather thick Indian Point bearing N by N
 distant about 5 miles
