

Remarks made on board Bk. W. P. Perkins
Saturday May 31st 1889

Begins with wind W. thick weather down
to under Indian Point middle part clear
several vessels in sight at 2 P.M.
lowered for whales at 7 1/2 returned
to the ship. Wind S.E. latter part
the same.

Saturday June 1st 1889

Begins with light breeze from the N.W.
working south middle part calm. Indian Point
bearing West distant about 5 miles latter
part light winds and calms

Sunday June 2nd 1889

Begins with light winds and calms middle and
latter part the same spoke the Helen Mer.
Indian Point bearing N.W. distant about 8 miles

Monday June 3rd 1889

Begins with light air and calm. middle part
the same. lowered for a whale at 10 o'clock returned
at 12 several vessels in sight latter part
blossing winds Indian Point bearing S.W. distant
about 10 miles

Tuesday June 4th 1889

Begins with light breeze from the S.W. at
10 o'clock anchored off Indian Point in 8
fathoms of water 2 vessels in sight middle
and latter part the same

Wednesday June 5th 1889

At anchor off Indian Point wind South. partially
clear spoke the Chamber and the La-Vintha
middle and latter part thick

Thursday June 6th 1889

Begins with thick weather and calm at
Anchor off Indian Point at 11 P.M. weighed
anchor and worked south several vessels
in sight wind S.E.

Friday June 7th 1889

Begins with wind from the N.E. working south
middle part working north Indian Point
bearing N.W. distant about 10 miles at
midnight anchored off the point

Saturday June 8th 1889

Leaving at anchor off Indian Point wind
N.E. clear several vessels in sight at 5 o'clock
got under weigh and lay off and on
the point

Sunday June 9th 1889

Strong wind from the N.E. with rain
off Indian Point. middle and latter part
the same spoke the Northern light and the
Hears

Monday June 10th 1889

Begins with thick weather and wind from
the N.E. Indian Point bearing S.W. distant
about 5 miles middle part the same
working to the windward. latter part the same

Tuesday June 11th 1889

Anchored off Little Island in 9 fathoms middle
and latter parts working S.W. wind S.E. thick

Wednesday June 12th 1889

Off Marcus Bay spoke the Grounding Billar
middle part anchored off Indian Point several
vessels in sight. wind N.E. latter part spoke the
Anchor Dick and received 25 bags of potatoes
from her several vessels in sight

Thursday June 13th 1889

Anchored off Indian Point the point bearing
N.E. distant about 2 miles. wind North weather
clear. at two o'clock lost the starboard
Anchor floated in shore of the ice several
vessels in sight

Friday June 14th 1889

Anchored off Indian Point wind N.W.
raining went North spoke the Abram Parker

Saturday June 15th 1889

Anchored off Indian Point received
an anchor from the Abram Parker. wind
North foggy

Sunday June 16th 1889

At anchor off Indian Point at 10 am
took our anchor and worked north wind S.
clear several vessels in sight

Monday June 17th

South Head of St. Lawrence Bay bearing
N.W. distant about 20 miles
