

Remarks made on board Bk Wm. Parlies

Monday August 12th 1889

At anchor off the point wind S.E. to S.W.
weather clear the ice on the land south of the
point. several vessels in sight

Tuesday August 13th 1889

At anchor wind S.W. weather clear the ice
and several vessels in sight the point bearing
S.W. by W. distant about one mile

Wednesday August 14th 1889

At anchor wind S.W. weather clear

Thursday August 15th 1889

At anchor wind S.W. to W. weather clear
with occasional snow squalls. the ice on the
point. several vessels in sight

Friday August 16th 1889

At anchor at Point Barrow wind N.E. to E
weather clear. latter part wind South rainy
weather several vessels and the ice in sight.

Saturday August 17th

At anchor at Point Barrow at 9 P.M. got under
weigh and started towards the S.W. wind N.E.
weather clear. the ice and several vessels in sight

Sunday August 18th 1889

Steering towards the S.W. in company with
several vessels. tracking the ice wind N.E.
weather cloudy with rain

Lat 70.31. Lon 164.00 Monday August 19th

Working to the S.W. wind light N.W.
weather clear several vessels and the ice in
sight

Lat 72.00 Lon 164.30 Tuesday August 20th 1889

Steering N.W. by W. close hauled, from 4 to 9 a.m.
thick. several vessels and the ice in sight
moving off to the westward along the ice
wind N.E.

Lat 72.40 Lon 162.00 Wednesday August 21st

Wind N.E. weather clear. working to the windward
two vessels and the ice in sight.

Lat 71.48. Lon 167.30

Thursday August 22nd 1889

Working to the windward along the ice. wind
N.E. weather clear. at 7 a.m. left off to the
west along the ice. P.M. tracking the ice to the
S. and W. three vessels in sight.

Lat 71.28. Lon 171.55

Friday August 23rd 1889

Working to the westward at dark hove to
on the eastern tack at daylight left off
along the ice wind N.E. weather snowy.
several vessels in sight. caught one bear.

Lat 71.15. Lon 170.25

Saturday August 24th 1889

Begins with light breeze from the N.E. with snow
squalls several vessels in sight working to the
eastward along the ice. middle part wind N.W.
spoke the Eliza & Hicks and the J. & Howland.

Lat 71.30. Lon 169.10

Sunday August 25th 1889

Begins with strong breeze from the N.W.
with thick weather. working to the N.E.
along the ice several vessels in sight

Monday August 26th

Lat 71.25 Lon 166.00 Working to the east several
vessels and the ice in sight wind N
weather thick

Lat 71.20 Lon 165 Tuesday August 27th

Working to the east wind N.W. weather
clear several vessels and the ice in sight
spoke the Jas. Allen here too at dark
on the Port tack at daylight stood to the
eastward strong breeze.

Lat 71.18. Lon 165.10 Wednesday August 28th

Wind strong N.E. weather partially
clear several vessels and the ice in
sight at 5 P.M. were around on the
starboard tack heading to the N.W.

Lat 71.10 Lon 166.20 Thursday August 29th

At 11 A.M. were around on the starboard tack
and worked to the east. wind N.E. weather
clear with snow squalls. the ice and several
vessels in sight
