

Remarks made on board Bark W. E. Bartles
Lat 71.11 Lon 166.10 Friday August 30th 1889
Begins with strong breeze from the N.E. working
along the ice to the eastward several vessels
in sight weather clear with snow squalls

Lat 71.15 Lon 166.45 Saturday August 31st
Spoke the Abram Barker wind N.E. weather
squally. the ice and several vessels in sight
working to the N.E.

Lat 71.25 Lon 168.30 Sunday Sept. 1st
Hove too off the ice wind N.E. weather
thick with snow squalls the ice and
three vessels in sight at daylight stood
to the westward along the ice at 7 1/2 P.M.
lowered 4 boats at 9 P.M. returned to the ship
spoke the Laveretia Monday Sept 2nd 1889

Lat 71.45 Lon 167.50 Begins with light breeze from the N.E. with
thick weather hove too along the ice at
daylight kept off to the westward three vessels
in sight

Lat 71.48 Lon 174.30 Tuesday Sept 3rd 1889
Begins with breeze from
the N.E. with snow several vessels and the
ice in sight spoke the Lancer at 5 P.M.
hove too on the eastern tack at 8 P.M.
worked along the ice to the N.W. latter
part the same spoke the Lancer

Lat 71.40 Lon 175.00 Wednesday Sept 4th
Herald Island in sight bearing S.W.
Island distant about 25 miles wind N.E.
weather clear several vessels in sight
working to the windward towards the ice
spoke the H. H. H.

Lat 71.30 Lon 174.10 Thursday Sept 5th
Begins with thick fog wind N.W. E.
hove too along the ice Herald Island
bearing S.W. distant about 20 miles.

Lat 71.30 Lon 173.50 Friday Sept 6th 1889
The same Herald island bearing S.W.
distant about 30 miles. weather clear

Lat 71.50 Lon 181.00 Saturday Sept 7th 1889
Begins with thick weather. wind east
working to the windward along the ice
several vessels in sight. Herald Island
bearing W. S. W. distant about 45 miles

Lat 71.40 Lon 169.10 Sunday Sept 8th 1889
Begins with strong breeze from the east with
thick weather working to the eastward
several vessels in sight latter part clear

Lat 71.45 Lon 166.00 Monday Sept 9th 1889
Begins with the wind from the S. E. S. W.
with thick weather working to the east
the ice and three vessels in sight

Lat 71.35 Lon 167.00 Tuesday Sept 10th
Begins with light breeze from the S. E.
middle and latter part calm hove too on
the Port tack two vessels and the ice
in sight. thick fog

Lat 72.00 Lon 168.10 Wednesday Sept 11th
Begins with calm and thick fog
middle part light breeze from the North
weather thick hove too along the ice
several vessels in sight

Lat 71.14 Lon 168.20 Thursday Sept 12th 1889
Begins with thick weather and light breeze
from the N. E. middle part clear the ice
and several vessels in sight working to
windward. latter part hove too along
the ice. saw one whale one rising.

Lat 72.00 Lon 169.10 Friday Sept 13th 1889
Begins with wind from
the S. W. E. with clear weather at daylight
kept off to the westward along the ice
and spoke the Jesse Freeman and the
W. E. Lewis received two men John Nelson
and John Rogers from the W. E. Lewis
spoke the Abram Barker and received
Mr. Enos from her. latter part wind east
working to the windward along the ice
