

Remarks made on board Bk. W. M. Baylis.

Lat 72.10 Lon 168.15 Saturday Sept 14th 1889
Begins with light breeze from the N.E. with clear weather working to the eastward along the ice several vessels in sight spoke the Bounding Billow

Lat 72.15 Lon 167.30 Sunday Sept 15th 1889
Begins with light breeze from the east with thick weather middle and latter part wind fresh from E.N.E. to E. the ice and several vessels in sight working to the windward

Lat 72.50 Lon 167.20 Monday Sept 16th 1889
Begins with wind from the east with thick weather middle part clear latter part thick weather several vessels in sight working to the eastward along the ice and spoke the Ocean.

Lat 72.30 Lon 169.00 Tuesday Sept 17th
Begins with strong breeze from the N.E. with thick weather hove too along the ice middle part working to the westward clear weather several vessels in sight. latter part hove too

Lat 72.25 Lon 170.00 Wednesday Sept 18th
Begins with fresh breeze from the N.E. squally weather laying aback along the ice middle part working both ways along the ice several vessels in sight going different ways

Lat 71.58 Lon 173.00 Thursday Sept 19th 1889
Begins with fresh breeze from the N.E. with squally weather hove too along the ice at 4 1/2 P.M. kept off to the S.W. latter part hove too two vessels in sight

Lat 71.50 Lon 174.10 Friday Sept 20th
Begins with light breeze from the N.E. layed aback along the ice spoke the Sea Ranger at noon kept off to the south at 2 1/2 P.M. lowered five boats the Port Bow boat went on and missed came on board at 4 1/2 P.M. lowered 4 boats

and returned to the ship at 5 1/2 with nothing four vessels and the ice in sight latter part working to the windward under short sail weather clear

Herald Island Saturday Sept 21st
Begins with fresh breeze from the N.E. with clear and cloudy weather at 8 A.M. sighted Herald Island bearing S.W. by W. distant about 40 miles. at 9 P.M. started to grapple for a sperm whale with two boats but did not get hold at 4 P.M. hooked him from the ship and straightened the grapplings the ice and several vessels in sight. latter part working to the windward

Lat 72.00 Lon 174.30 Sunday Sept 22nd 1889
Begins with fresh breeze from the N.E. with clear weather working to the windward middle part the same several vessels and the ice in sight latter part working to the windward

Lat 72.15 Lon 173.30 Monday Sept 23rd 1889
Begins with strong breeze from the East with clear weather middle part the same spoke the Peconic working to the windward along the ice three vessels in sight

Lat 72.45 Lon 170.10 Tuesday Sept 24th 1889
Begins with light breeze from the East with partially clear weather middle part snow squalls several vessels in sight working to the N.E. along the ice

Lat 72.25 Lon 170.45 Wednesday Sept 25th 1889
Begins with light breeze from the east with snow squalls middle part the same spoke the Eliza working along the ice several vessels in sight. latter part wind S.E. hove too along the ice
