

Remarks made on board H. W. Baylin.

1889 Civil Time, Dec 4th 1889

At about 10 A.M. took our anchor and towed to sea, at 6 P.M. steering by the wind heading S.W. on the Port back Point. Begins leaving N.E. distant about 10 miles, the latter part fair breeze from the S.

Lat. 37.20 Lon. 125.10 Thursday Dec 5th 1889
Begins with strong breeze from the S.W. steering by the wind on the Port tack, middle and latter part wind light all hands employed in ship's duty

Lat 36.55 Lon 127.50 Friday Dec 6th 1889
Light airs and calm the entire day.

Lat 36.15 Lon 129.05 Saturday Dec 7th 1889
Begins with a breeze from the N.E. with rain squalls middle and latter part the same.

Lat 34.10 Lon 126.50 Sunday Dec 8th 1889

Begins with light winds and calm at midday wind N.W. moderate, at sundown the same two vessels in sight, steering S.

Lat 33.40 Lon 124.10 Monday Dec 9th 1889
light breeze from the S.W. the entire day

Lat 32.37 Lon 123.5 Tuesday Dec 10th
Light breeze from the South working to the windward

Lat 31.40 Lon 122.08 Wednesday Dec 11th 1889
Begins with light breeze from the S.W. middle and latter part the same steering by the wind heading from South to E.S.E.

Lat. 27.30 Lon 123.10 Thursday Dec 12th 1889
Begins with light breeze from the S.W. with fine weather, middle and latter part the same heading from S to S.W.

Lat 28.20 Lon 125.12 Friday Dec 13th 1889
Begin with light breeze from the S.W. middle and latter part the same with fine weather working to the windward

Lat 27.30 Lon 126.00 Saturday Dec 14th 1889
Begins with light breeze from the N.E. to West, middle and latter part wind from the S.W. with rain squalls steering from S by E. to S.W.

Lat 25.35 Lon 126.05 Sunday Dec 15th 1889
Begins with light N.E. wind with fair weather and continues so the entire day steering S.W.

Lat 24.25 Lon 126.50 Monday Dec 16th 1889
Light N.E. wind with fine weather throughout the entire day

Tuesday Dec 17th 1889
Begins with fresh N.E. wind with squalls, weather steering from S.W. to S.W. middle and latter part the same

Lat 23.35 Lon 128.00 Wednesday Dec 18th 1889
Begins with strong breeze from the N.E. with clear weather middle and latter part squally.
