Feb Tuesday 11 1890
 anker at sipan & A.W. all hands
 employed on ship duty and got of
 several boats loads of wood and the
 Charles doubling moxon spoke us first
 after we anker and so ends this day

Feb Wednesday 12 1890
 boating of wood and potatoes
 and finished all of our wood tubs
 A.W. and finished potatoes P.M.

Feb Thursday 13 1890
 all hands employed as ship duty
 laying at anker at sipan

Feb Friday 14 1890
 Sailed from sipan with the
 wind N.E. & E steering N.W. all
 sail set

Feb Saturday 15 1890
 This day begins with rain and
 squally and wind N.E. & E steering
 N.W. and found one man stoop
 away bod of us

Feb Sunday 16 1890
 Lat 20.21 This day begins with fine weather
 and so ends steering N.W. wind from
 E.N.E.

Feb Monday 17 1890
 This day begins rain and squally strong
 breeze S.E. steering N. and at P.M. cald
 of and the wind shifted to N. and the
 ship heading N.W. on the wind starb tack

Lat 21.42 Feb Tuesday 18 1890
 This day begins with good weather
 and so ends wind from N.W. & E
 heading N.E. but on the starb tack

Feb Wednesday 19 1890
 This day begins with light breeze from
 the N.W. heading head N.W. & P.M.
 and at one half in to N.W. heading N.E.

Feb Thursday 20 1890
 This day begins with the wind from
 the west steering N.W. and at four P.M.
 wind fell into the N.W. heading N.E.
 weather squelley under short sail

Feb Friday 21 1890
 This day begins with strong breeze
 from N.W. heading N. and at 8 P.M.
 wore ship and stood to S.W. and so ends

Feb Saturday 22 1890
 This day begins with strong breeze
 from N.E. steering N.W. and at eight
 A.M. kep. her of to N.W. wind
 moderated a little raised land at five
 P.M. bearing N.W. distance about
 thirty five miles

Lat 26.2 Lon 142.11 Feb Sunday 23 1890
 This begins with lite air from S.E. steering
 N.W. and at one P.M. kep. her of to N.E.
 and at five raised land bearing N.E. & E
 heading east & S.

Feb Monday 24 1890
 This day begins with strong breeze from
 S.W. anker at foren island one P.M.
 and at five P.M. blowing a gail from S.W.
 both ankers down

Feb Tuesday 25 1890
 This day begins with strong breeze from
 N.W. and all hands ashore getting
 water and so ends this day

Feb Wednesday 26 1890
 This day begins with lite air from
 N. all hands getting water and so ends
 Feb Thursday 27 1890
 all hands getting water

Feb Friday 28 1890
 This day begins with lite air from S.W.
 all hands employ ship duty
