

Remark Made On Board B. K. W. Maylies

March 1st Saturday 1890

One watch ashore on liberty and the rest of the men employed on ship duty

Sunday March 2 1890

the starboard watch came on board at seven A M and the port watch went ashore on liberty

Monday March 3 1890

at seven A M the port watch came on board and the starboard watch went ashore

Tuesday March 4 1890

the starboard watch came on board and port watch went ashore and the rest of the men taring down and during the night one boat was sent to forward and clear away boat and

Wednesday March 5 1890

and the watch came on board and then we layed away to boats to look for the boat and we found her about seven miles around the island and we got to the ship at seven A M with the boat and finished taring down

March Thursday 6 1890

lite air from N W all hands employed on ship duty

March Friday 7 1890

lite air as usual from N W all hands employed on ship duty

March Saturday 8 1890

strong breeze from S W squelley all day washed ship

March Sunday 9 1890

lite air from N E all hands on board so ends this day

March Monday 10 1890

commenced to paint ship and it came on to rain and we did finish

March Tuesday 11 1890

all hands to work painting ship and finished four P M on and so forth

March Wednesday 12 1890

this day being rainy and squelley and wind from N E and so ends

March Thursday 13 1890

lite air from N E reping boats

March Friday 14 1890

lite air from N E painting boats and at 6 P M to boats and they went on shore and they diverted

guy wire and Henry March Saturday 15 1890

lite air from S E painting boats diverted Will and Charles Hine

March Sunday 16 1890

lite air from S E all hands on board

March Monday 17 1890

all hands employed on ship duty

March Tuesday 18 1890

painting work lite air from S W

March Wednesday 19 1890

still laying at Boilands Island

March Thursday 20 1890

still laying at Boil Island

March Friday 21 1890

still laying at Boil Island

March Saturday 22 1890

all hands employed on ship duty

March Sunday 23 1890

all hands on board as usual

March Monday 24 1890

lay at Boil Island yet and mister Leacer has left the ship

March Tuesday 25 1890

brought them back and then he went ashore in
