April Wed 23 1890

this day being with good from S W rain all day and at three P M hall to E heading N N E on the wind

April Thur 24 1890

Lat 37.7 thick fog wind from S E
Lon 151 steering S E. bell with quite breeze
hands employed on various jobs

Lat 40 Lon 153

April Frid 25 1890

this day being with strong breeze from S W and at one P M hall to W N W doing a good breeze hands employed on various jobs

Lat 42.46 Lon 155.57 April Sat 26 1890

this day being with strong breeze from W steering S E. bell and at five P M steering S E half N

Lat 45.7 Lon 159.35

April Sun 27 1890

this day being with strong breeze from W steering S E. bell

Lat 47.29

April Mon 28 1890

this day being with wind from S and large P M hall to S E steering S E. bell strong running under bar top sails

April Tues 29 1890

this day being with strong breeze from S S W and at four P M wind hall to W N W and thick and snowing all day steering S E. bell

April wed 30 1890

this day being with strong breeze from W N W and at four P M hall to W snow all day hands employed on various jobs

Lat 54.25 Lon

Thur May 1 1890

this day being with light breeze from W N W steering S E and at one P M wind hall to S E heading S W on the starboard tack hands employed on various jobs

Horace Montray Webster

Fri May 2 1890

this day being with wind from S S W heading S E and snowing and at seven A M clear off hands employed on various jobs

Sat May 3 1890

this day being with wind from S steering S E. bell very light breeze put out two boats and reefing one

Sun May 4 1890

this day being with light breeze from S E heading S W on the wind starboard tack weather very clear

Mon May 5 1890

this day being with wind from S E heading S W with very clear hands employed on ship duty

Tues May 6 1890

this day being with strong breeze from S S W first part of the day snow at seven A M clear off stand to eastward on the port tack

Wed May 7 1890

this day being with fresh breeze S W heading S E the first part of the day snowing

Lat 60.1

Thur May 8 1890

this day being with snow and light air from W N W and at five P M died out calm hands employed various jobs put out the port bow boat

Frid May 9 1890

this day being with snow and at eight A M clear of fresh breeze from S E ship heading E on the port tack hands employed on various jobs put up cutting blocks and falls

this day being with strong breeze from W N W at six the ice at seven A M heading S E and at six P M spoke dark punter at six wind hall to west working to the westward
