This day fore Part Strong Breeze from the N.W. Raised Land At daylight the Asses, Cars, Bearing N.W. 25 miles where ship & stood on the Starboard Tack At sundown Blowing moderate Gale from the same quarter

Sunday Feb 15th

Lat 31° 10' Long 127° 47' Light wind from the N. Steering N.W. By N. Saw Whaling Bark to windward, Mail Boat Calm Latter Part Light wind from the Westward Saw two Steamers & several finbacks

Monday Feb 16th

Fine weather with moderate Breeze from the N.W. Steering By the wind on the Starboard Tack Saw Land At daylight Bearing N.E. By East 40 miles

Tuesday Feb 17th

This day Strong Breeze from the N.W. Steering By the wind on the Port Tack Latter Part Blowing A moderate Gale Saw a Bark to Leeward

Wednesday Feb 18th

Lat 30° 30' Long 125° 55' This day fore Part Strong Breeze from the N. Steering By the wind on the Starboard Tack Latter Part moderating on the Port Tack

Friday Feb 20th

Light wind from the Eastward in the morning mail Port Calm Latter Part Light wind from the Westward Employed Breaking out fore Seal

Saturday Feb 21st

Lat 30° 15' Long 126° 15' This day fore Part Light wind from the S.W. Gained the Steam whaling Bark Jesse Freeman Nothing the Libson Saw one fishing Boat Latter Part foggy

Sunday Feb 22nd

This day very Light winds from the S. & fog Saw one Dink

Monday Feb 23rd

This day fore Part Calm & fog Latter Part Light wind from S.W. the fog raised a little At sundown Saw two vessels wth our weather Row could not make them out

Tuesday Feb 24th

Lat 30° 33' Long 125° 55' This day Light Northerly winds Steering to the N. & E. Saw one Dink Employed making Spungarn
