Sunday Apr 26th
This day moderate breeze from the S.W.
working through the ice at sundown
Luffed to Abuck in a large hole
at daylight for light and kept off
N. by E. Let the mizzenal plenty off
Clear water ahead mid part Lyons Ark
In the latter part took the ice making
to the five sail in sight

Monday Apr 27th
This day strong breeze from the S.W.
fore & mid part Lyons Ark latter
part took the ice working to the north
five vessels in sight

Tuesday Apr 28th
This day light wind from the S.
working to N. five vessels in sight
mid & latter part fast in the ice

Wednesday Apr 29th
This day fore part light winds from the
S.E. & clear weather. Still fast in the
ice six other vessels in sight mid part
the same latter still fast

Thursday Apr 30th
This day wind the same foggy weather
Ship fast in the ice mid & latter part
the ice opened worked to the N. & as 5
miles

Friday May 1st
This day fast again saw a large
bowhead in a hole close by the ship
could not get to him mid part blowing
strong from the N.E. all sail furled
latter part ice opened a little made some
sail moved ahead about 2 miles when the
ice closed again

Saturday May 2nd
This day light wind from the S.E.
& fine weather at 5:30 P.M. saw
whale close to the tried to get to with
line but could not 4 vessels in sight
to the windward mid & latter part
wind the same fast in the ice

Sunday May 3rd
This day wind from the S.E. moderating
still fast in ice mid part the same
latter calm

Monday May 4th
This day fore part calm still fast
5 vessels in sight mid part the same
latter part light wind from the N.E.
ice started made sail & worked to the
S.W.

Tuesday May 5th
This day light wind from the N.E. with
some snow every thing furled fast in the ice
mid part ice opened a little worked
to the S.E.

Wednesday May 6th
This day fore part wind from the N.
fine weather saw a bowhead close
to the ship could not get to him
ten vessels in sight Cape Moverin
in sight bearing N.E. 40 miles latter
part the same

Thursday May 7th
This day still in the ice light northerly
wind eleven vessels mid & latter part
the same
