

Tuesday Aug 4th

This day strong breeze from the W. N. W.
Steering by the wind On the Port tack
Latter Part sighted the Park Sea to the
Eastward of us

Wednesday Aug 5th

This day fore Part wind from the N. W.
working to the windward Along the edge
Of the Sea several vessels in sight

Thursday Aug 6th

This day strong breeze from the same
quarter working Along the Park Sea
sight vessels in sight Latter Part
wind from the N. E. & Light

Friday Aug 7th

This day fore Part Light wind from the
N. E. & foggy morning with Bark Alice
Knowles & Hunter Latter Part blowing
strong from the same quarter standing
off & on the Sea

Saturday Aug 8th

This day blowing strong from the N. E.
morning off & on the Sea under short
sail several vessels in sight

Sunday Aug 9th

This day Light wind from the N. E.
& fine weather spoke the steamer William
Lewis Latter Part morning with the
Bark Abram Barker

Monday Aug 10th

This day fore Part moderate breeze
from the N. E. morning the Barker
mid Part beating to windward along
the Sea Latter Part the same

Tuesday Aug 11th

This day fore Part morning with Barks
Abram Barker & Andrew Hesk All three
vessels steering to the S. mid Part the
same Latter Part steering to the S. E.
through scattering ice sighted the Land

Wednesday Aug 12th

This day strong breeze from the N. E.
steering by the wind On the Port tack
Plenty of ice mid Part going to under
short sail Tack & Tack Latter Part calm
& vessels in sight

Thursday Aug 13th

This day Light wind from the S.
steering to the N. Along the Land Latter
Part Anchored in 7 fathoms of water
Natives on Board

Friday Aug 14th

This day wind from the N. got under
way beating to the N. in company
with the Bark Sea Ranger Latter Part
the same very little ice saw plenty
of devil fish

Saturday Aug 15th

This day wind the same working to
the windward Along the Land mid
Part the same Latter Part Anchored
in six fathoms of water 5 miles to
the S. of Wainwright Inlet, the Revenue
Cutter Bear & several other vessels at
Anchor

Sunday Aug 16th

This day Light wind from the N. E.
got under way. mid Part working to
windward Latter Part Anchored in five fathoms
of water 4 steamers & 7 sailing vessels in sight
