

1892 Remarks from on board the whaling Bk William Baylies

Fri Mar 4 Cruising off the Islands of Waihou and Makia
This day strong breeze from the N.E. working to
underdred tacks and tack. Saw several sails and kumbrakes
Middle port the same. Latter part took in the upper
Top sails. William Macoy one of the men forward
had some words at the Wheel with the Capt
and we put him in Irons and down in the run.

Sat Mar 5

This day strong breeze from the N.E. took in the
Fore sail and set the fore stay sail at Sun down
took William Macoy out of Irons and he went
on duty. Several Gales and land in sight -
Middle port the same. Latter part set the fore sail
and upper main Top sail

Sun Mar 6

This day strong breeze from the E. heading along
by the wind under short sail. Middle port the
same. Latter part moderate breeze made sail
heading along by the wind

Mon Mar 7

This day begins with light breeze from the E. heading
along by the wind to the underdred of
Waihou. Sate Black Fish and 2 Gales. Middle port
a calm latter part, little breeze made all sail
water broke out Water

Tues Mar 8

This day begins with cloudy weather and soon after
strong breeze with rain. Laying aback with
top sails cut, spoke the Bk F. A. Barstow
Middle port the same, latter part strong breeze
working to underdred under lower Top sails
and stay sails. Several sails and land
in sight -

Wed Mar 9 Cruising off the Islands

This day strong breeze from the N.E. still working
to underdred under lower Top sails and stay sails
between Waihou and Makia, several sails in sight
Middle port the same, latter part good weather
made sail and run down off Honolulu

Thurs Mar 10

This day a good breeze from the N.E. about 2 P.M.
lowered the Boat Boat and took the light on shore
Boat came on board and we stood off and on
waiting for the Steamer. Middle port took in the
Main Sail and light sails. Latter part strong
breeze fueled upper fore Top sail and Fore sail
and set the fore and main stay sail

Fri Mar 11

This day strong breeze and rugged from the N.E.
still working to underdred under short sail
saw the Steamer from San Francisco go into
Honolulu. Several sails in sight
Middle port the same. Latter part set the fore sail
and Mainsail and went into Bay and met
a Boat from shore with a letter from the Capt
and then stood out again

Sat Mar 12

This day strong breeze from the N.E. working
to underdred under whole Top sails and fore sail
Middle port Laying aback. Latter part I went in
as far as the Boat and Anchored in 30 fathoms
of Water and the Water Boat came along side
and we took about 175 Barrels of Water and Potatoes
and Onions and Bananas

Sun Mar 13

This day begins with a strong breeze from the N.E.
about 1 P.M. hove our Anchor up and set our
Top sails and Fore sail and Mainsail and
Work to underdred. Middle port the same. Latter
part still a strong breeze took in the upper Top sails
