

1892 Remarker from on board the Whaling Bk William Baylies

Sun Mar 27 Lat 37.11 North

This day begins with light breeze from the S.E. steering N.W. with all sail set nothing in sight. Middle part the same. Latter part cloudy

Mon Mar 28 Lat 38.20. Long 162.24 West

This day very light breeze from the S.E. steering N.W. with all sail set nothing in sight. Middle part the same. Latter part a good breeze and foggy part of time

Tues Mar 29 Lat 40.22 Long 162.42

This day begins with light breeze and foggy from the S.E. steering N.W. with all sail set nothing in sight. Middle part the same. Latter part a good breeze

Wed Mar 30 Lat 43.29 Long 162.55

This day begins with a strong breeze from the S.E. steering N.W. with all sail set nothing in sight. Middle part the same. Latter part strong breeze and rugged took in the upper fore topsail and with the starboard bow boats up on the upper cranes

Thurs Mar 31 Lat N.C. O.B.

This day strong breeze and rugged from the S.E. steering N.W. with all sail set nothing in sight. Middle part the same. Latter part wind hauled to the S. and a while then hauled back to the S.E. strong breeze with rain, took in some of the light sails

Fri April 1 Lat 47.47. Long 166.20

This day begins with a strong breeze and a heavy fog from the S.E. steering N.W. with all sail set nothing in sight. Middle part took all the light sails and upper fore topsail, latter part wind moderated some, set the upper topsail and light sails steering N.W. by W

1892 Benjamin D. Cleveland. Master

Sat April 2

This day strong breeze from the S.E. steering N.W. with all sail set nothing in sight. Middle part wind hauled to the N.E. and squally, latter part strong breeze took in the light sails and upper fore topsail, and put the port bow boat up on the upper cranes

Sun April 3 Lat 49.21 Long 170.10 West

This day strong breeze with hail from the N.E. heading along by the wind, at sundown took in the main sail and put the main stay sail nothing in sight. Middle part the same. Latter part wind died out and was a calm with good weather

Mon April 4 Lat N.C. O.B.

This day begins with a moderate breeze from the S.E. steering N.W. with all sail set. Saw first backs Middle part the same. Latter part strong breeze took in the light sails and upper topsails and main sail

Tues April 5

This day begins with a gale from the S.E. hauled in the wind and took in the lower fore topsail and fore sail trying to under lower main topsail and staysails blowing strong with hail squalls nothing in sight. Middle part wind moderated. Latter part made all sail, and about 11 A.M. saw land one of the Fox Islands

Wed April 6

Bearing Sea
This day a good breeze from the S.E. steering N.W. with all sail set. Sailed along the land for the 72 pass. Middle part the same. Latter part strong breeze came through the Lee Guam pass from the Pacific Ocean into the Bearing Sea.
