

1892 Remarks from the Whaling Bk William Baylies
Bearing Sea.

Thurs April 7 Lat $54^{\circ} 00'$

This day begins with strong squalls from the S & about 1 PM two boats went in a fishing came on board without any made sail steering NW by N. the Island of Fox Green in sight Middle part the same. latter part wind light with rain and snow

Fri April 8 Lat 54.49 Long 176.08

This day begins with a light breeze with rain and snow from the S & E. Steaming NW by N with all sail set. nothing in sight. Middle part the same. latter part wind hauled to the NW strong breeze took in the light sails

Sat April 9 Lat 54.47 Long 177.05

This day begins with a strong breeze from the NW NW heading along by the wind. Water broke out before and back nothing in sight. Middle part the same. latter part good weather made all sail

Sun April 10

This day begins with a light breeze from the S & E steering NW by N. half N. no ship in sight. Middle part the same. latter part strong breeze, took in the light sails and upper topsails and mainsail and fore sail

Mon April 11 Lat 58.11 Long 179.00

This day begins with a gale from the S & E took in the lower fore topsail and hauled in the wind under lower main topsail and stay sails. Nothing in sight. Middle part the same. latter part wind moderated and we made all sail steering NW by N half N

Tues April 12 Lat 56.06

This day begins with a strong breeze from the S & E steering NW by N. at sundown took in the light sails and upper fore topsail nothing in sight. Middle part the same. latter part made all sail

1892 Benjamin D Cleveland Master

Wed April 13 Lat 61.20 North Long 179.03 East

This day begins with a moderate breeze from the S & E steering NW by N. half N. Middle part took ship. latter part wore ship and made all sail. At day light saw the Bark California and after breakfast the Capt came on board of us, and about 10 AM raised the J.C. crossed the Meridian 180 degrees one day a head

Fri April 14 Lat 61.49 Long 179.55 East

This day strong breeze and foggy from the S & E laying around in the ice under short sail. Middle part thick fog. latter part fast in the ice the California and Brig F A Burston in sight

Sat April 16

This day begins with a light breeze with fog squalls from the S & E still in the ice with the wheel broken in. Middle part a calm. Clewed up all sail, latter part got a breeze and made all sail. Cape Navarin and Cape Thaddeus in sight about 40 miles off

Sun April 17 Lat 56.06

This day moderate breeze from the NW got out of the ice about one PM working to windward with all sail set. 3 whales and land and ice in sight. Middle part the same. latter part strong breeze

Mon April 18

This day begins with a strong breeze from the W & W gamed the Bark Belvidere and about sun down the California lowered for a whale land and several whales in sight. Middle part working to windward. latter part wind the same working leads in the ice up towards Navarin

Tues April 19

This day moderate breeze from the W & W working leads in the ice. water repaired the fore top main stay sail. several sails and plenty of ice and land in sight. Middle part the same. latter part still working leads in the ice
