Wed Nov 16 Lat 57.57 Long 124.16

This day begins with rain squalls and wind hauled to the N.W. steering E. by N. took in some of the light sails. Michel Klen and Ben Butler are on duty again. Middle part a good breeze. latter part the same saw a Merchant Schooner

Thurs Nov 17

This day quite a strong breeze from the N.W. steering E. by N. at 11 AM raised the land the coast of California at day dark raised point-Rais light and Farlowe light - point-Rais light bearing N.W. & about 20 miles off Farlowe light bearing about N.E. & about 15 miles off. Middle part laying aback. latter part made sail at day light and steered off E. half S. and about 7 AM took the tow boat Rescue and about 11 o'clock AM we anchored in San Francisco. It ends the voyage of the Bark William Baylies
