

Nov 17 This Day began with fine weather and a light N.E. wind Thermometer 17 below I heard that a man had died on Board of the Thrasher afterwards found it was a Lie it has been very fine I am here at 10.30 set at 1.30 the Captain Wifes and Children were out for a stroll Capt Pennymann and his Mate are both layin up with colds nothing serious so ends &c

Nov 18 This Day began with fine weather wind E. N. E. Thermometer at 7 a.m. stood 25 below and it is fine walking weather November is working on towards its end and I say let her work went ashore after Breakfast and had a walk went on Board of the Jessy Freeman a little while then went down to the hill when they were sliding on sleds & I see it has been a bright beautiful Day Thermometer at Dark stood 20 below went on Board of the Narrack to Night met Mrs and Capt Wick had Candy & Corn Balls and came on Board at half past Ten and so ends this Day

Monday 19 This Day began with fine weather Wind N.E. Thermometer 17 below Zero at 11 a.m. went on shore Foul around considerable after a storm for my Native Hermit got an old one at last The man that got to roze on the Thrasher is coming out all Right my Hunters Little Girl is all most Dead. The wind is Brezing up strong I think another old Blizzan is getting ready to Blow. The Voyage of Life and Whaling are both shorting so ends &c

Tuesday 20 This Day began with fine weather and light westerly wind Thermometer 13 below and all hand in good health with good appetites went on shore at 10 a.m. and staid until 3.30. nothing of Interest has transpired so ends This Day

Wednesday 21 This Day began with Fazy weather Wind W. S. W. Thermometer at 13 below. after Breakfast took a walk over to the Ice Pond. it was quite cool on the Hills went on Board of the Thrasher. While there the Egilicks came in with 250 lb Deer meat 40 lb Fish spent the Evening on Board the Narrack Capt & Mrs Porter of the Freeman were there had Candy Cards &c. so ends this Day

Thursday 22 This Day began with fine weather light westerly wind Thermometer 23 below Zero to Day there has nothing transpired of any interest ^{they don't} looking around to find an Oil Tank to melt fresh water in middle and latter part fine weather so ends

Friday 23 This Day began with fine weather Thermometer 20 below Zero at 2 O'clock went on Board of Narrack and had Dinner while there was invited to a social time on Board of the Narrack Beluga we enjoyed ourselves nicely so ends

Saturday 24 This Day began with fine weather Thermometer 15 below at 12 a.m. Egilicks were paid off and started for home in the Evening went on Board of the Freeman and spent the Evening another gang of Egilicks have comeing the Freeman get three of them. Beluga two and Thrasher two or one I believe. they brought in about 1100 lb of meat Deer & moose, and we pay about 60¢ a lb in trade at cost price of trade that is considerable skinning to get them on Board of some of the Ships they came about 6 Days journey with Dogs and Toboggans they have Dogs harnessed in with traces and Saddles and some of them have Bills on they made quite a Gay and curious appearance. Tomorrow is Sunday the 25th and it is the 36th Anniversary of my going to Sea a long time. I ends &c
